Faculties - problems and solutions

A message from the Rural Dean, Revd Canon Tim Heaton

Churchwardens and anybody else involved or interested in the faculty procedure are warmly invited to attend Deanery Synod on Tuesday 20 January, 2 for 2:30pm, at Shillingstone Church Centre, Blandford Road, Shillingstone, DT11 0SW, to hear a presentation by Dan Crooke and Revd Canon Jonathan Triffitt on the faculty system and the internal review carried out by the diocese in 2025. Dan is the DAC Secretary, oversees the Church Buildings Team and is Diocesan Lead for Net Zero. Jonathan is the Deputy Diocesan Secretary, Director of Ministry & Mission and Bishop's Missioner. They will address the concerns that arose in January 2025 and Deanery Synod's vote of no confidence in the faculty procedure.



Readings Sunday 18th January Epiphany 2

Isaiah 49.1–7 Psalm 40.1–12
1 Corinthians 1.1–9 John 1.29–42

1 Corinthians 1.1–9 (NIV)

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes,
² To the church of God in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be his holy people, together with all those everywhere who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ—their Lord and ours:

³ Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus. ⁵For in him you have been enriched in every way—with all kinds of speech and with all knowledge— ⁶God thus confirming our testimony about Christ among you. ⁷Therefore you do not lack any spiritual gift as you eagerly wait for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed. ⁸He will also keep you firm to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹God is faithful, who has called you into fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

John 1.29-42 (NIV)

The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! ³⁰This is the one I meant when I said, ‘A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.’ ³¹I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel.”

³²Then John gave this testimony: “I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him. ³³And I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, ‘The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.’ ³⁴I have seen and I testify that this is God’s Chosen One.”

³⁵The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. ³⁶When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, “Look, the Lamb of God!”

³⁷When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. ³⁸Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, “What do you want?”

They said, “Rabbi” (which means “Teacher”), “where are you staying?”

³⁹“Come,” he replied, “and you will see.”

So they went and saw where he was staying, and they spent that day with him. It was about four in the afternoon.

⁴⁰Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. ⁴¹The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, “We have found the Messiah” (that is, the Christ). ⁴²And he brought him to Jesus.

Jesus looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas” (which, when translated, is Peter).
