CLERGY THOUGHTS

The season of Lent is nearly upon us. From earliest times, Lent has been a time of preparation and penitence in preparation for the Great Feast of Easter. A time when we follow the example of Jesus devoting himself to prayer and fasting in the Judean wilderness.

In the early church people would wear sackcloth and ashes during Lent, as a sign of penitence, before being baptised on Easter Sunday. Over time the whole church adopted the practice of observing Lent with prayer and fasting, as well as alms giving and acts of service. Today churches around the world observe the season of Lent.

It's important to know that Lent isn't about proving how holy and spiritual you are. Instead, Lent is for those who are all too aware of how they 'fall short of the glory of God'. For those who know how much they need God's mercy, forgiveness and help.

We will begin Lent on Ash Wednesday with services in each of the clusters in the West Wight Benefice. For all of us who want to learn to love Him a little more, this marks the beginning of a journey into the wilderness with Christ, the place where we too can face the temptations and 'besetting sins' of our daily lives and with God's help, overcome them.

A word of advice though, don't try to deal with everything in one go. Ask God to show you the one thing he would like to you focus on. Do that and let him guide you through Lent.

The Lent Courses that are being hosted in the benefice are both a learning opportunity and a helpful support for those times when temptation feels too strong and you long to give in. It's fine to phone a friend in these circumstances.

Lent is a time of discipline, of self-reflection and spiritual seeking but it is not a time for misery and long faces. Instead, as we seek to follow Jesus more faithfully by letting go of cheap and transient delights, the emptiness we fear becomes filled with an ever deeper and growing joy.

So do not be afraid to enter the wilderness. Instead, be surprised by the joy that awaits you. May it be your strength.

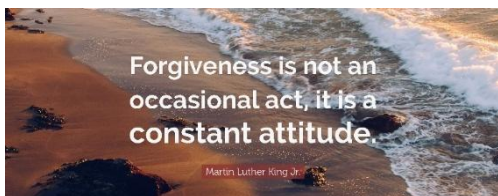

CURATES' CORNER

February often feels like the hinge of my year as it is halfway through the school year, and in the church calendar it certainly keeps me on my toes. We begin with Shrove Tuesday, the day when the Church reminds me that repentance can involve lemon, sugar, and an alarming amount of batter. Traditionally

it's about being "shriven" – saying sorry, clearing the decks, and preparing the heart – but if I'm honest, it's also very much about pancakes. If I manage both, I feel I'm doing rather well.

The very next day, the mood shifts as I arrive at Ash Wednesday. I swap frying pans for ashes and hear the quiet, honest words: "Remember that you are dust." It sounds solemn (and it is), but I often find it strangely freeing. I'm reminded that God knows exactly what I'm made of – and loves me anyway.

And so, I step into Lent. For me, Lent isn't about being gloomy or heroic or proving how disciplined I can be. It feels more like a gentle journey: making space, paying attention, and trying to walk a little more closely with Jesus. Whether I give something up, take something up, or simply pause more often, Lent invites me to slow down and listen.

Half term, pancakes, ashes, and a journey of grace – February has more flavour than I might expect.

FLIPPING GREAT FUN: THE YARMOUTH TOWN PANCAKE RACES!



Dust off your frying pans —the annual Yarmouth Town Pancake Races are almost here!

This isn't just a race; it's a high-stakes, batter-filled showdown. We are thrilled to announce that children from across the Federation of the Church Schools of Freshwater & Yarmouth and Shalfleet will be descending upon the town to compete. With participants ranging from our tiny-but-mighty 3-year-olds to our seasoned 11-year-old pros, the square is set to become a blur of flying pancakes and determined faces.

Competitive Spirits & Flopped Flapjacks

While we call this a "shared community event," let's be honest: once that whistle blows, the competitive spirit is real! We expect to see some impressive sprinting but remember—it's not just about speed. A runner is only as good as their flip. We anticipate a fair few "floor pancakes" (which, sadly, do not count toward the trophy), but it's all part of the glorious, sticky fun.

Why Do We Do This? (A Quick History Lesson)

You might be wondering why we're all gathered in the street tossing cooked batter into the air. The tradition of the pancake race is said to have begun in 1445 in Olney, Buckinghamshire.

Legend has it that a frantic housewife heard the church bells ringing for the Shrove Tuesday service and realized she hadn't finished her pancakes. Not wanting to waste the precious fats (which were forbidden during Lent), she ran to the church still wearing her apron and clutching her frying pan, flipping the pancake as she went so it wouldn't burn.

Centuries later, we carry on this legacy—mostly because it's a brilliant excuse to see our local community (and teachers!) looking slightly ridiculous in the name of tradition.

A Moment for the Community

Beyond the flipping and the sprinting, this event is a wonderful opportunity for the Federation and the wider town to come together. It's about:

- **Historic Legacy:** Keeping Yarmouth's unique town traditions alive and kicking.
- **Connection:** Bringing Freshwater, Yarmouth, and Shalfleet families together in one big, chaotic celebration.
- **Joy:** Watching an 11-year-old try to maintain dignity while a pancake lands on their head.



Whether you're there to cheer on the children or just to see if anyone manages a "double flip," we can't wait to see you there. May your tosses be high and your landings be steady!

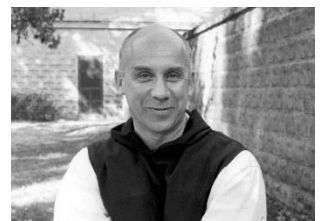

... at the St Agnes Contemplative Prayer Group

~ from CONJECTURES OF A GUILTY BYSTANDER by Thomas Merton

"At the centre of our being is a point of nothingness which is untouched by sin and by illusion, a point of pure truth, a point or spark which belongs entirely to God, which is never at our disposal, from which God disposes of our lives, which is inaccessible to the fantasies of our own mind or the brutalities of our own will.



This little point of nothingness and of absolute poverty is the pure glory of God in us. It is so to speak God's name written in us, as our poverty, as our indigence, as our dependence.

It is like a pure diamond, blazing with the invisible light of heaven. It is in everybody, and if we could see it we would see these billions of points of light coming together in the face and blaze of a sun that would make all the darkness and cruelty of life vanish completely ... I have no program for this seeing. It is only given. But the gate of heaven is everywhere".
