

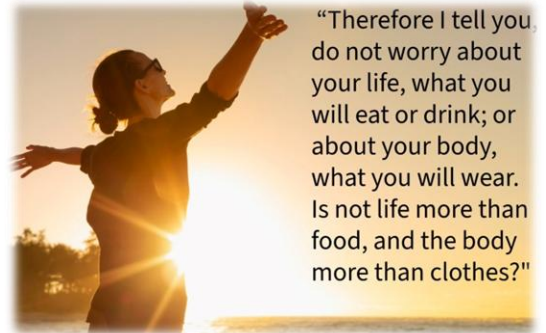

## ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT

Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> February marks the beginning of Lent. There will be a service of Holy Communion at 11.30 at St Bridget's including an invitation to be marked in ash with the sign of the cross. Ashes are an ancient sign of penitence and this custom has been followed since the Middle Ages. Please make a special effort to begin the season of Lent by coming along. During Lent we do not have flowers in church, the Gloria is not used, and we avoid using the word Alleluia in our worship – saving all of these for the great celebrations of Easter Day.



## LENT – A TIME TO REFLECT AND PREPARE

Lent is a time of reflection and preparation, and here are a few things which may help:

**LENT CALL** A chance to talk to someone else about the Bible reading used in church that week. No previous knowledge needed – it's simply a short phone call or facetime chat about what struck you, perhaps what puzzled you or particularly spoke to you. If you're interested let Paula know.

**LENT BIBLE REFLECTION** at the home of Joy Alcock, Tuesdays at 2pm – let Joy know if you would like to go along. The theme will be the Gospel reading for the week.

**SOMETHING MORE** Small group discussion to explore questions of faith. A simple format of listening to material presented and then a chance to discuss **Session 1** How might we understand and encounter God? **Session 2** Who is Jesus and what difference might he make to our lives? Days and times to be confirmed but let Paula or the Rector know if you would like to come along.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS a 30 minute service** each Friday at 12 noon in the Chapel at St Bridget's, from Friday 20<sup>th</sup> February to Good Friday. We will reflect on two stations each week, allowing time for prayerful meditation as we journey together toward Easter. All are warmly welcome to pause, pray, and walk the way of the cross with us during this sacred season.

**EARLY MORNING SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION** at St Bridget's on Thursdays at 7.30am.

## ECO CHURCH of local interest: Peak Cluster proposals re carbon capture

You may be aware of plans to construct a pipeline to convey CO<sub>2</sub> captured from industrial processes from Derbyshire and Staffordshire, which will pass from there through the Wirral to the coast near Meols. Despite assurances from Peak Cluster, there are many unanswered questions as to possible 'greenwashing', safety and environmental damage. Whatever your views, please be aware of developments which could potentially have a radical impact on our local environment.

## VAT FOR CHURCHES

Changes to the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme coming into effect from March this year mean that churches like St Bridget's and Caldy will no longer be VAT exempt on building work and repairs. We really need the government to ensure that **all** listed places of worship across the UK can reclaim **all VAT costs on repairs and maintenance** of their buildings. Having to pay VAT on any building schemes will put many churches at risk of closure.
