ROMANS IN THE NEW TESTAMENT - PUBLIUS

When Paul and his companions travelling from Caesar Philippi to Rome are shipwrecked on the coast of Malta, the Islanders rescuing them, take the party to the home of Publius, the Governor of Malta. Publius provides generous hospitality to the party until they can charter a new ship to finish the journey to Rome. He treats them with great kindness and during his stay, Paul cures the father of Publius from a fever. Publius seems to have been converted to the Christian faith by Paul and later becomes the first Bishop of Malta. Tradition says he was martyred about the year 125 AD when he would, have been a very old man. There are a number of Churches in Malta dedicated to him and he is recognised as a saint by the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches.

Once again, another example of a man of great integrity who became a man of great faith.
