

1st of Lent



Matthew 4.1-11

Collect

Almighty God,
whose Son Jesus Christ fasted forty days in the wilderness,
and was tempted as we are, yet without sin:
give us grace to discipline ourselves in obedience to your Spirit;
and, as you know our weakness,
so may we know your power to save;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

by it you nourish our faith,
increase our hope,
and strengthen our love:
teach us always to hunger for him who is the true and living bread,

1st of Lent: Genesis 2. 15-17; 3.1-7, Romans 5.12-19, Matthew 4.1-11

2nd of Lent: Genesis 12.1-4a, Romans 4.1-5,13-17, John 3.1-17.

As we begin Lent, the gospel tells of Jesus, led into the wilderness by the Spirit for forty days and forty nights, fasting so he was famished and then tempted by the devil. Temptation is something all humans face and there are many examples in scripture from Eve, tempted by the serpent to eat the fruit of the tree which God had strictly forbidden, to Ananias and Sapphira tempted to hang on to part of the money they had promised to give to the early church (Acts 5). Our modern world is full of reports of those who have been tempted by envy, greed, lust, and pride and daily we need to deal with those little temptations; cheating a little, telling a 'white' lie, being selfish, ignoring injustice and many more. Jesus' forty days and nights fasting in the wilderness his temptations and encounter with the devil may seem far from our experience, but he who understands our frail humanity shows us the way to deal with temptation, encouraging us to follow him.

Immediately before his time in the wilderness, Jesus had been baptised by John and heard encouraging words of commendation from his heavenly Father, "This is my Son my beloved with whom I am well pleased", words repeated at Christ's Transfiguration, our gospel reading for last week. In the desert, Jesus had time to ponder on his divine nature as he experienced hunger, discomfort, and loneliness, marks of his human nature. This coloured his response to the devil's temptations, emphasising that in all things God comes first, God provides for our physical needs and for our deep spiritual hunger, God is to be trusted not tested and God is the only one we should worship and serve. We pray regularly not to be led into temptation, but putting God first will help us resist temptation, though if we fail, acknowledging our failure we can seek forgiveness from Jesus whose wilderness experience was in preparation not only for his ministry but for his suffering and dying for love of us on the cross.

Prayer

God of the desert, as we follow Jesus into the unknown, may we recognise the tempter when he comes; let it be your bread we eat, your world we serve and you alone we worship. Amen

Pastoral Visiting - If you would like to receive the Eucharist at home please contact me by phone or email. **Keith**



Clergy Meeting On Tuesday morning at 11am Retired clergy and LLMs are invited to join us at 38 Herringston Road for our clergy meeting.


Music at St Peter's


