Hopes and Dreams - prayers  
from the pupils of Oak Hill School

Dear Friends

As I write I am reminded of our reading from The Acts of the Apostles where we read about the conversion of St Paul. St Paul had one goal in mind – he was straining with all his might to obtain that goal - and that was to know Jesus Christ; no wonder he had such a lasting impact on the world because it makes a real difference when you know what your goal in life is and then give yourself unreservedly to that goal. We don't always fulfil our dreams, but having a compelling goal is surely a vital ingredient in an effective and successful life. I pray that the pupils from Oak Hill school will fulfil their 'Godly' hopes and dreams.

In my experience, some Christians don't have a clear understanding what God expects from them, some seem to be going through the same monotonous routine every day, but without a purpose and no real goal. I read that Swiss psychologist Carl Jung wrote: 'most of the people I see, suffer not from physical illness but from spiritual aimlessness, they have lost their aim and sight of who they really are and what is really valuable.'

Not so St Paul, who says 'I want to know Christ, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.'

This leads me nicely into the season of Lent!

It can be helpful to think of Lent, as a sort of medicine, especially if you feel you're suffering from spiritual aimlessness; it's an opportunity to strengthen us in the things that are good, reign in other facets of our personality and reset the compass to the true North of following Jesus - Spring clean of the soul if you like.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on the 18<sup>th</sup> of February. Many Christians go public with their intention to keep a good Lent by being 'ashed' – the sign of the Cross made on the forehead which is a mixture of Ash and Holy Oil blessed at a special service by the Bishop. We are holding an Ashing Service **in Alderton at 7.00pm, on the 18<sup>th</sup> February** where we shall be using the 'Blessed Ash.' All are welcome.

Having been 'ashed' the intention of the 40 days of Lent is to maintain a steady course closer to God – perhaps making a vow to do something 'spiritually extra' every day such as spending more time in prayer or reading your bible more regularly.

Lent reminds us that we walk with Jesus on the way to the cross, and, as St Paul has it, being mindful too of Jesus's choice of the Cross as a way for us to enter those riches more fully, leading to eternal life; and it helps us to face the immensity of that sacrifice, and the immensity of God's riches made available to us in Jesus. We need all the 'Strengthening medicine' we can get especially, at present, living in such a troubled world.

You're invited to a 4-week Lent course commencing on Wednesday **25<sup>th</sup> February, at 7.30pm**, meeting at **The Vicarage, Alderton**, and thereafter on the 4<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of March.

During this coming Lenten season, let us give the primacy to Jesus Christ; may Jesus be the centre of our life, at all times, in every relationship, every decision, every action, every word and each longing of the heart; may Jesus lead us to live a life of spiritual richness rather than gaining what this world can offer.

As we prayerfully develop our Lenten practices, ready for action, may our 'fasts and resolutions' lead us closer to Christ, closer to one another, and please God, closer to the Kingdom of Heaven. Amen.

**CHURCH ELECTRIC HEATING PROJECT:** the initial stage of this has been completed - National Grid have put in a phase 3 cable which provides a bigger electric current for the electric pew and wall panel heaters. The next part of the work will start in April after Easter to allow the bats to roost - we have to wait until then because of advice from the Bat Conservation Society having spotted several bats in Church and other evidence of them. However, this ties in well with the start of spring as then we first of all have to have the gas heating system taken out - not something to be done in winter. After this all the new heaters will be put in.
