For the attention of Kate Osborne MP

We are writing to you as constituents and as members of **St Albans Church**, based in the Windy Nook area of Gateshead. As a church rooted in our local community, we witness daily the realities faced by people struggling to secure safe, secure, and affordable housing.

Within our congregation are people who volunteer and work with **Gateshead Foodbank** and **Oasis Community Housing**. As a church, we actively support these organisations through donations of food and money, volunteering our time, and raising awareness of poverty and housing insecurity across Gateshead. Through this work, we see first-hand the human cost of the ongoing shortage of social housing.

Too many people in our borough are living in poor-quality, insecure accommodation. These conditions often have a serious and lasting impact on physical and mental health, family stability, and overall wellbeing. In many cases, the problem is not simply the condition of housing, but the stark reality that there is **not enough social housing available in Gateshead**.

For many years, people were encouraged to purchase their council homes, yet replacement social housing has not been built at anything like the scale required. This has contributed directly to the housing crisis we now face. While we acknowledge and welcome Gateshead Council's pledge to build

500 homes over the coming years, we believe this figure falls far short of what is needed. Furthermore, we are deeply concerned that too few of these homes will be genuinely affordable social housing.

As your constituents, we are asking you to **use your voice and influence** to challenge Gateshead Council and central government to do more. We urge you to advocate for a significant increase in the provision of **safe, secure, and truly affordable social housing**, ensuring that new developments meet the real needs of local people.

Housing is not merely a policy issue; it is a matter of dignity, justice, and community wellbeing. Everyone deserves a safe place to call home.

We, the undersigned, ask you to act on this issue with urgency and determination.
