Eco Tip of the week

If you are planning to cook something special, these tips can help you reduce the impact of your meal:

1. Use in season food - Buying food that is out of season can rack up your emissions. Perishable foods that are grown in green houses and flown in from far away are the worst offenders.

For example, a pack of asparagus flown in from Peru is worth 3.5kg CO₂e yet a local in season pack is only 125g CO₂e.

2. Make extra for later - Make the most of any extra effort you put in and cook more than you need on the night to make yourself lunches/dinners from the leftovers. This is a great way to make the most of your time, save money and reduce food waste whilst creating easy tasty meals.
