Update from Upbeat Clean

This month we wanted to include a story of one of the community partners that we work with and who share our values.

Sinfin Moor Church employs Winnie from Upbeat Clean to ensure that we are providing a clean quality space for all the Church Centre Users. Through Upbeat Clean we are also helping provide a Living Wage and making a positive impact for people who face big challenges.



Not sure who Upbeat Clean are? - Upbeat Clean is a charity-owned commercial cleaning business that provides excellent service to companies and churches in Derby.

Upbeat Clean was established by Upbeat Communities who have served refugee communities in Derby for over 15 years, seeking to help people who have fled their countries rebuild their lives here in Derby.

Upbeat Communities was aware that refugee women, who have shown such resilience and bravery in supporting their families through traumatic events, often have a real challenge finding flexible work that fits around childcare. This often leads to years of unemployment and the serious challenges that come with that. After considering dozens of Social Enterprise

opportunities, we started Upbeat Clean to provide flexible, 'Real Living Wage' employment that can help refugee women and others support their families and rebuild their lives.

Here's Upbeat Clean latest update and a story of another one of their workers

"I couldn't speak English when I came here. I didn't even understand the numbers when I had to buy something. People were laughing at me in the shop because I didn't know how to pay."

This is Crystal's story of finding employment with Upbeat Clean while rebuilding her life in the UK.

Upbeat Clean is one of two social enterprises run by Upbeat Communities, the other being Derby Language School. Both exist to offer outstanding services, and fulfilling, ethical employment—in partnership with some of the biggest companies in Derby.

Crystal is one of many refugee women whose lives have been utterly transformed after encountering Upbeat.

"The first day in a new country, you feel good. But after that, you feel like you are alone. To be new in a country is not easy. You arrive and you have no friends, no family at all. Upbeat helped me a lot, beyond English classes. The volunteer who befriended me helped me to understand what to do when I was pregnant. She gave me baby clothes and essentials. Upbeat was like my second family."

As Crystal slowly began to rebuild her life in the UK, raise a family, and learn to speak English fluently, Upbeat supported her into employment.

"My friend told me about a job opportunity as a cleaner. At first, I didn't know it was Upbeat. But when I met Michael, I realised it was the same person who helped me before, in the English classes. It felt like a full circle moment. I started my first job in the UK at the same place where I had first learned to speak English. Now, I am so happy to be able to provide for my family. When I get paid money, each time, I can do something for my kids."

We are delighted that Upbeat Clean has been recognised by the King, receiving the King's Award for Enterprise—the highest official UK award for British businesses.

Upbeat Clean is the first company in Derbyshire to do so. It's our privilege to partner with some fantastic organisations across the city to genuinely transform lives through cleaning, empowering people like Crystal to step into their full potential.

Upbeat Communities has a long history of innovation as a charity. Since we began in 2005, we have always sought to be led by those seeking sanctuary, listening to their needs and responding with lasting solutions.

As we journeyed with people to support them to rebuild their lives, it became clear that finding meaningful employment was a huge challenge— particularly for refugee women.

Women like Crystal were experiencing barrier after barrier to accessing work, from language difficulties, to needing to care for children around their working hours.

All our cleaners are able to gain a Real Living Wage, mentoring opportunities and supported employment, all while having the flexibility to maintain a balanced family life. We are absolutely delighted that our cleaners have been recognised for their excellence by the King, and we are excited for what the future holds for each of these incredible women.

Rev Fiona's Update



As one of the curates in Sinfin Moor, a lot of my role here is seeking ways to build community and share God's story on the new housing estates in our parish. Those that live here are of all faiths and culture and so I need to think 'out of the box' as to how to draw neighbours from across the world together.

In the past we've done carol singing and Christingle to share the story of Jesus' birth but this year we did an adapted version of the Mexican tradition called Las Posadas. The tradition commemorates Mary and Joseph's difficult walk from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of a warm place to stay. (Posadas is Spanish for lodgings) From December 16th to the 24th the whole village walks from home to home dressed as angels and shepherds asking if they can stay. Having been turned away they reach the designated house and are invited in for food and celebrations and the retelling of the Christmas story.

On the estate we did "A Journey to Christmas" starting with the figures from a nativity scene of Mary, Joseph and the Donkey. We walked through the estate knocking on doors (mostly of the Food & Faith members) asking if there was room. There was no room but each house gave us another nativity figure - shepherds and sheep, angels and wise people. As we walked we talked about their part in the story and we finished at our 'stable' - the gazebo, festooned with fairy lights waiting to offer us a welcome with hot chocolate, mulled wine, mince pies and singing.

As the Christmas busyness fades away this January, join me in praying that the story of how God 'moved into our neighbourhood' (John 1:14 The Message translation) will remain in the hearts and minds of those that encountered Him, walking with friends and neighbours through the streets of their estate one cold December evening.



And even when our journey feels difficult - like Mary and Joseph's - may we all know that God is with us.
