CASTLE ACRE PARISH COUNCIL – JANUARY REPORT 2026

Castle Acre Parish Council (PC) held its regular monthly meeting on Thursday 8th January 2026, with two members of the public in attendance.

CAPC annual precept application: At the meeting of 08/01/2026, your Parish Council confirmed and voted for a precept application request of **£25,881.02**. This request was submitted to KLWN BC by the Clerk on 09/01/2026 prior to the 31/01/2026 deadline. Hopefully, as residents already know, CAPC manages a variety of services on behalf of the Village, for example the cutting of Village Greens and Playing Field, managing Allotments, Streetlighting, Parish Trees, Defib, Tourist & Dog waste bin collections. The PC continues to experience price increases on the services it purchases: for example, the weekly emptying of Tourist and Dog waste bins is budgeted to cost £2,434.43 for 2026/7, more than double the 24/25 cost of £1,181.50. The annual cost of all grass cutting, management of parish hedgerows and trees is budgeted at £7,186.42 and all Insurance costs being £1,929.50. Castle Acre Parish Council thanks all volunteers for their time and goodwill, without which our costs would potentially be higher. To view accounts please visit:

South Acre Road and Ford TRO (Traffic Restriction Order) ref: WTRO5199 & Order 202X (27491804) Ref: PJA0069 Prohibition of Motor Vehicles (Except Solo Motorcycles)

CAPC had received notification from NCC/NP Law advising the Parish Council and Residents that order 202X Ref: PJA0069 stating the need for a permanent TRO and closure of the South Acre Road / Ford would be going to public consultation (representation deadline 06/01/2026); notices were also advertised in the EDP.

The TRO consultation was discussed at the meeting of 11/12/2025 (minute ref 42) with CAPC voting unanimously to support the NCC TRO. CAPC sent their response and representation reflecting this on 12/12/2025, backed by survey results in Castle Acre's adopted Neighbourhood Plan (page 49) of which 389 responses (93% of Residents surveyed) supported the permanent closure. The continuation of the South Acre Road closure has been due to increased water levels and safety concerns for road users and Environmental concerns given the rare nature of this SSSI River Nar chalk stream and protected species therein.

Reminder: the temporary TRO restriction extension of time is currently projected to end on 27th February 2026.

Castle Acre Horticultural Society

The problem with 'titles' is that sometimes the long ones can be a little off-putting . . . that's not the reason we abbreviate the more important part of our own group name to 'Hort Soc' — it's simply easier and quicker to say! We now have over 100 members and we're here for them all and for our local community. The core of our membership is full of down-to-earth, hands-on gardeners who know quite a bit about 'gardening' and are always willing to share their practical experience; many of us are also members of The Royal Horticultural Society (usually abbreviated to the RHS).

The countdown to RHS Chelsea Flower Show 2026 seems to have well and truly started (*May 19-23 at the Royal Hospital, Chelsea in London*) and whilst there will always be complaints about showground overcrowding and television's focus on celebrities, there is already growing media concern that Chelsea (and other RHS Shows) are becoming disconnected from 'real' and achievable gardening ie. the sort most of us do! — so we'll be watching developments with interest.

With help from AI, the RHS has already analysed aspects of 'real gardening' throughout 2025 and these are a few of their published conclusions:*

- that 4.6% of Great Britain is gardenised green space (that's 3 times the area of National Nature Reserves);
- that 42% of domestic gardens are now paved over (55% of front garden spaces and 36% at the back);
- that 19 million trees can be found within Britain's domestic garden spaces;
- that the RHS can reach its target of helping 15,000 community gardening groups by 2030;
- that butterflies definitely bounced back in 2025 — but that we shouldn't get too complacent!
- that we've gone potty for home-made compost and the days of peat are definitely numbered;
- that 2025 was a good year for roses, cornflowers and aubergines, but was quite a bad year for brussels sprouts;
- that by following the principle of 'right crop, right place' you really CAN grow a food crop almost anywhere;
- that fungi are the gardener's best friend and that slugs are not the enemy;
- that we can safely add AI to the modern gardener's toolkit.

Thanks to Head Pupils at Castle Acre CofE Primary Academy who sent in a summary of all that happened during the Autumn Term of 2025.

We had a really busy Autumn Term – the first 15 weeks of the new school year seemed to fly by! We welcomed 13 new children into **Reception** at the beginning of September. They looked so little and slightly nervous with uniforms that were slightly too big. We also welcomed many new children across all year groups; we now have 86 children on roll, apparently more than we have ever had! Everyone has now settled in amazingly and it is like our new members have always been here.

Our learning has been really exciting. **Rowan Class** have learnt about transport, past and present and also about our local area. They have drawn maps and have written a guide about the village. 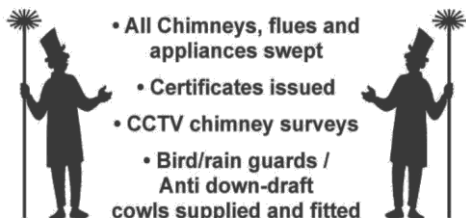

The Chair opened the meeting; apologies were received from Cllr Williams and accepted.

Councillors agreed the precept for 2026, an increase of 3.4% on the last financial year.

A precept is a financial payment from Breckland Council to Town & Parish Councils to cover the Parish Council running costs.

Councillors discussed the potential High Grove Solar Farm, a Labour Government project; planning permission will be decided by the Government inspectorate based in Bristol. The project will not impact on the village of Narborough directly, as the land identified for the development is opposite RAF Marham's outer perimeter at the top of Chalk Lane joining the A1122. Breckland Councillor Wilkinson was asked to communicate with High Grove to make sure a transport management plan is in place when construction starts, to prevent a heavy vehicle rat run through Narborough.

Due to the Local Government Reorganisation (LGR), Breckland Council and all District and Borough Councils will be dissolved and replaced by 1, 2 or 3 unitary authorities by 2028, unless the Government reconsiders. In the event of the LGR going ahead, Breckland Council has offered Breckland-owned land to Town and Parish Councils to purchase.

Councillors discussed the 3 pieces of Breckland-owned land in Narborough. Councillors felt that the land had no potential to develop or be a future asset. The Parish Council felt it would benefit residents for the land to transfer to the new authority, who will have to honour future maintenance costs.

NARBOROUGH C of E PRIMARY ACADEMY

Head pupils Lexi, Sophie, Logan and Khloe were roving reporters during the Autumn Term 2025, tasked with writing an article for The Nar Valley News to inform the local community about what pupils at Narborough Primary Academy had been up to.

Hedgehogs Class (Nursery & Reception) had fun on a trip to High Lodge to follow the Gruffalo trail through the woods. Children have also enjoyed learning phonics, how to read and the phonics songs. In their literacy drawing club, they have learned about Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Stick Man and Little Red Riding Hood. They said the trip to Jack and the Beanstalk was really fun!

Squirrels Class (Yrs 1 & 2) enjoyed going to High Lodge and exploring the Gruffalo trail for a school trip. They also went to the pantomime to watch Jack and the Beanstalk and practised for their nativity "It's a baby" which the whole school and parents came to watch. They have been learning about Egypt in English and have also enjoyed growing plants in science. For their physical education, they have been learning some ball skills such as throwing, catching and dribbling.

Foxes Class (Yrs 3 & 4) enjoyed going to Norwich Castle Museum to learn about the Ancient Egyptians. They have also been going swimming and practising backstroke. In English, they have been writing a non-chronological report about Egypt, whilst in maths, they have been using the column method for addition and subtraction. In Design Technology they loved making structures using matchsticks and blue tack. In physical education lessons, they have been practising skills for football and playing some matches: it was great fun! In their science lessons, they have been learning about sound so they got some string and two paper cups to make a phone, then they listened to all the sounds.

Otters class (Yrs 5 and 6) have enjoyed going on different trips, including The Norwich Castle Museum to learn more about the Romans and the Iceni. Year 5 children went to Norwich Cathedral to join other schools to learn about the St Benedict Project. They have been to TNHA to compete against other schools in sports hall athletics. They have also enjoyed improving their swimming skills. In design and technology lessons, they have been learning to sew using blanket stitch to make a fish cushion. For physical education, they have also enjoyed gymnastics where they have been practising different jumps, including the pencil, tuck, full turn and half turn jumps. In art they have learnt to draw using the 1-point perspective to complete a picture. In French they have been learning and practising vocabulary about families.

Ready for Christmas, they learnt to play jingle bells on the recorder so they could play it in front of their families at the school's Carols Around The Tree service. Also, they have been writing a sequel to UFO diary in their English lessons. In science they have enjoyed learning about planets in our solar system, and have loved learning about lines of longitude and latitude in Geography.

The whole school participated in the Strictly Come Dancing challenge for the Children in Need charity.

For the last treat of the year, children from Reception to Year 6 went to the Corn Exchange in King's Lynn to watch the pantomime Jack and the Beanstalk- it was great fun!

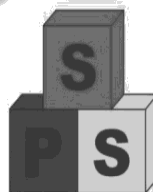

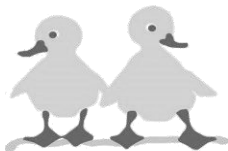

Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) – everyone's business

Please could everyone who is able to, respond to this government consultation on the proposed local government reorganisation (LGR). The government wishes to do away with district councils and county councils and create a single unitary council in its place, which is not a bad thing in my opinion if done properly - it would save people wondering which council to report a faulty streetlight or bin collection to, or where to go for help with schools or social services.

The new council could take the form of just one council for the whole of Norfolk, 2 councils (West and East including Norwich) or 3 councils (West plus Brecks, North plus East, and Greater Norwich). The Government is consulting us on which option to take.

In my opinion, a single unitary authority covering the whole of Norfolk would be very tricky to administer, and would create a distance between the people and the council. 3 councils would give us the best local representation.
