


Pancake Day, or Shrove Tuesday, is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent – the 40 days leading up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, Anglo-Saxon Christians went to confession and were “shriven” (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call people to confession. This came to be called the “Pancake Bell” and is still rung in places today.

Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday, so the date varies from year to year and falls between February 3 and March 9. In 2026 Shrove Tuesday will fall on 17th February. Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients.

A pancake is a thin, flat cake, made of batter and fried in a frying pan. A traditional English pancake is very thin and is served immediately. Golden syrup or lemon juice and caster sugar are the usual toppings for pancakes.

The pancake has a very long history and featured in cookery books as far back as 1439. The tradition of tossing or flipping them is almost as old: “And every man and maide doe take their turne, And tosse their Pancakes up for feare they burne.” (Pasquil’s Palin, 1619).

The ingredients for pancakes can be seen to symbolise four points of significance at this time of year:

- Eggs ~ Creation
- Flour ~ The staff of life
- Salt ~ Wholesomeness
- Milk ~ Purity



To make 8 or so pancakes you will need 8oz plain flour, 2 large eggs, 1 pint milk, salt.

Mix all together and whisk well. Leave to stand for 30 minutes. Heat a little oil in a frying pan, pour in enough batter to cover the base of the pan and let it cook until the base of the pancake has browned. Then shake the pan to loosen the pancake and flip the pancake over to brown the other side.

Bishop Sarah Mullally DBE on Wednesday 28 January became the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury, at her Confirmation of Election at St Paul's Cathedral. She is the first woman to hold the office in its 1,400-year history.

The Confirmation of Election is a legal ceremony, set within a church service, at which Bishop Sarah, the Archbishop-Elect, legally became the Archbishop of Canterbury. Archbishop Sarah's first act as Archbishop was to take up the Primatial Cross and give the blessing at the end of the service.

DEANERY SYNOD ELECTIONS 2026

You will be aware that triennial elections to Deanery Synods are due in 2026.

Diocesan Synod has agreed has approved the following (unchanged) basis of lay representation by parishes to Deanery Synods, i.e.

- (a) 1 representative for parishes under 26 names on the electoral roll;
- (b) 3 representatives for parishes with 26 - 200 names on the electoral roll;
- (c) 1 additional representative for each further 100 names or part of 100;
- (d) 1 additional representative from each authorised District Council

These representatives should be elected at the Annual Parochial Meeting and they will hold office for a period of three years from **1st July 2026**. They must be 16 years of age or upwards and fulfil the requirements of Rule M8 of the Church Representation Rules as set out on the reverse of this letter.

Details of the names and addresses of those elected should in due course be sent to the Secretary of your Deanery Synod and to this office marked for the attention of the Diocesan Electoral Registration Officer (email jo.durber@lichfield.anglican.org). The deadline for the receipt of this information at the Diocesan Office is **1st July 2026**, though it would be very helpful if you could let us have the information as soon as the elections have been completed.

CRR M8. (1) A person is qualified for election as a parochial representative of the laity to the deanery synod or the PCC under Rule M6(1)(a) or (b) if-

- (a) the person is aged 16 or over
 - (b) he or she is an actual communicant, and
 - (c) his or her name is on the roll of the parish and, unless he or she is aged under 18 at the date of the election, has been on the roll for at least the preceding six months.
- (2) But if the person has his or her name on the roll of more than one parish, he or she must choose one of the parishes concerned for the purpose of qualifying for election as a parochial representative of the laity to the deanery synod.
- (3) A person may not be nominated for election under Rule M6(1)(a) or (b) unless-
- (a) The person has indicated his or her consent to serve, or
 - (b) There is, in the opinion of the meeting, sufficient evidence of his or her willingness to serve.

Notice Mission and Pastoral Measure 2011 Draft Pastoral Scheme

The Lichfield Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committee has prepared a draft Pastoral Scheme for:
the union of the benefice of Oakengates, Priors Lee and Wrockwardine Wood, the benefice of St Georges', the benefice of Wombridge and the benefice of Donnington Wood (their constituent parishes to remain distinct) in the diocese of Lichfield and for the establishment of a team ministry for the new benefice of East Telford. It also provides for the cure of souls in the new benefice to be shared by a team rector and one team vicar, for the housing arrangements for the team and for the future patronage arrangements for the new benefice.

The draft Scheme is on the Commissioners' website www.churchofengland.org/consultation or you may obtain a copy from me. **Large print and/or audio copies are available on request.**

- Anyone may make representations **for** or **against** all or any part of the draft Scheme (please include the reasons for your views) by post or, preferably, by email to reach the Commissioners no later than midnight on **Monday 16 February 2026**. **Please send your representation to rex.andrew@churchofengland.org or letter marked for the attention of Rex Andrew, Pastoral Division, Church Commissioners, Church House, Great Smith Street, London, SW1P 3AZ.**
- If they have not acknowledged receipt of your representation before this date, please call 020 7898 1743 or email them to ensure it has been received. For administrative purposes, a petition will be classed as a single representation and the Commissioners will only correspond with the sender of the petition, if known, or otherwise the first signatory for whom they can identify an address – "the primary petitioner".
- When making a representation, please indicate the nature of your interest in the proposals (e.g. parishioner, member of parochial church council, etc) and whether you would like an opportunity to speak to their Committee regarding your representation if the Commissioners decide a hearing should be held regarding the case. Please ensure you provide contact information so that they can be in touch with you regarding later stages of the process.
- If they receive representations against the draft Scheme, they will send them, and any representations supporting the draft Scheme, to the Bishop whose views will be sought. Individual representors and the primary petitioner will then receive copies of the correspondence with the Bishop (including copies of all the representations) and will be told whether a hearing is to be held. They and individual petitioners may comment further to the Commissioners. Copies of all of the representations received and associated correspondence will normally be published on the Commissioners' website if the matter needs to be considered by them.
- If a hearing is held, anyone may attend the meeting of the Commissioners that considers the case and representors may have an opportunity to speak to their Committee. Otherwise, if a hearing is not to be held, the case will be considered in private and you will be informed accordingly.
- When they acknowledge representations the Commissioners will let individual representors (and the primary petitioner) know the next few dates of their Committee's meetings. They will confirm the actual date if a hearing is to be held nearer the time.
- The Commissioners' will decide if the draft Scheme should proceed when they consider all the representations on the basis of a paper prepared by the Commissioners' staff and any points raised at the meeting.
- The Commissioners will notify all representors of their decision and give a statement of the reasons for it.
- If they so decide, any representor or petitioner against the draft Scheme may seek leave from the Privy Council to appeal against the decision.
