A nice car/ holidays/ TV bundle might also feature in what our ideas of 'success' look like.

Isn't it funny though - that we can have all of those things, and yet not flourish? Perhaps even feel a little trapped by them, pressured to keep doing, keep achieving, keep paying. And on the flip-side - isn't interesting to notice that individuals and communities can flourish - experience joy, peace, community, contentment - without any of the outward 'trimmings' of success?

Following the Jesus-way, exploring the Christian life - is about flourishing, not success. It's about living in the world in such a way that I - and those around me - experience joy, peace, community and contentment - Whether the 'outward trimmings' of success are present or not. That's what makes the Jesus-way, the Christian life, so radical, and as relevant today as it was 2,000+ years ago. This Jesus-way, this Christian life - is what we try and explore together on a Sunday morning. It's not an easy way, and it doesn't guarantee success... but it offers something worth far more. May God show us the path of life, the way of flourishing - and give us the courage to choose it.
