Take part in shared silence

We are looking for volunteers to experience shared silence as a spiritual discipline this Lent.

What?

In a world full of noise and distraction, and where we may be fearful of silence, you are invited to take part in a research exercise into how religious practices might contribute to social connection and human flourishing, conducted by Otago University.

Participants will take part in four hour-long sessions. The first three sessions will include 10, 20 and 30 minutes of silence. In the fourth session participants' shared reflections on their experience will be recorded. Participants will also take a short survey at the start and again at the end of the four weeks; and keep a journal, noting responses to three questions once a week, which will also be shared with the researchers.

The research findings will be shared, in anonymized form, according to academic practice. Consent will be required, and can be withdrawn. Benefits for participants include learning about and sharing in a religious practice.

Who?

Anyone aged 18+ and who is willing to take part, regardless of affiliation or previous experience.
