## WEEKLY REFLECTION

### Racial Justice Sunday

This Sunday, churches across Britain & Ireland will mark Racial Justice Sunday, more than a date, given the current climate in our nation. It is essential for us as CHW Churches to reflect on the call to racial justice, to celebrate the beauty of human diversity, and to renew our commitment to ending racism and discrimination in all its forms.

The Churches Together in Britain & Ireland [CBTI] theme, **“Coat of Many Colours”** invites us to rejoice in the rich multicultural reality of the Church today. It reminds us that the body of Christ is made in the image of God—diverse and without distinction of race. Catholic Archbishop of Southwark recently affirmed, racial justice is not confined to a single day; it is a daily calling that shapes every encounter with every person, whatever background or circumstances. While we celebrate the diversity within our own congregations, we must also acknowledge that inequality persists both in society and within the Church. The Church of England’s **From Lament to Action** report urges us to move beyond conversation and take meaningful steps toward inclusion and equity.

This week, I invite you to join me in 3 commitments:

- **Pray:** That our communities may be generous in fostering a place all can flourish and truly belong.
- **Learn:** By deepening our understanding of the experiences of our diverse, Global Majority Heritage [GMH] brothers and sisters.
- **Act:** Challenge prejudice wherever we see it and celebrate the God-given gifts of every person.

In a world scarred by prejudice, hate speech, and growing division, the Church is called to be a beacon of God’s justice and love. Racial justice is not only a moral responsibility; it is a spiritual one. **“Every person is created in God’s image”** [Genesis 1:27]. When we confront discrimination, we honour the divine spark in one another and bear witness to Christ’s reconciling love. As followers of Christ, may we live out the truth of Galatians 3:28: **...we are all one in Christ Jesus.** May this Racial Justice Sunday renew our commitment to transform hearts, communities, and nations. Amen

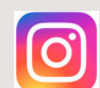
