



Inspiring and hope-filled

Last week, from Monday 2nd to Wednesday 4th February, Rev Simon and Susan Walsh attended the Leading Your Church into Growth (LYCiG) Conference at the Hayes Conference Centre in Swanwick, Derbyshire. They were joined by other churches from across the Diocese making up Cohort 8, including parishes from Oswaldtwistle, Langho and Wesham, along with a large contingent from the Church of Scotland.

The conference brought together clergy and lay leaders for three full and intensive days of study, reflection, prayer, worship and practical exercises, all designed to help churches begin or renew a journey of growth. While much of the conversation around the Church nationally can feel dominated by stories of decline, it was both encouraging and refreshing to hear



accounts of hope – stories of how the Good News of Jesus Christ continues to inspire renewal and growth in churches across the country.

Bishop Philip, who previously served as a trustee of the Leading Your Church into Growth charity, is championing the programme across the

Diocese, with the hope that the majority of parishes will have the opportunity to take part over the coming years. The programme is being supported through funding from the national Church, recognising the importance of helping local churches grow in confidence, faith and mission - *continued over...*

Over the next few months, we will begin to unpack the themes and ideas explored at the conference with the PCC and the wider church community, discerning together what this might mean for us here at St Leonard's and setting realistic and prayerful goals for growth. Central to this journey is prayer, and many of you will already have received the LYCiG prayer cards that encourage us to place growth firmly in God's hands.

One of the simple phrases that emerged during the conference has stayed with many of those attending: "I'm going, it's going to be good — would you like to come too?" It captures something of the spirit of the journey ahead: hopeful, invitation, and rooted in trust that God is already at work among us.

Please continue to pray for this process, and for all those giving their time and energy as we explore together what the next chapter of life at St Leonard's might look like.
