


Bible Lessons: Exodus 24: 12-end p82 2 Peter 1: 16--end p1222 Matthew 17: 1-9 p984

Like many other small, rural churches, our wonderful St Bartholomew's Church is in real trouble. Despite all the fundraising events we have been holding recently and are planning for this year, our cashflow forecast suggests that funds will run out by the end of this year.
