*Hope is the thing with feathers
That perches in the soul,
And sings the tune without the words,
And never stops at all.*

In This Week's Scripture...

"For in hope we were saved"

Romans 8: 24

'Do not worry' says Jesus. It's a hard call, with our own life experience and with the news around the world. We know, from experience, that life can sweep you under... Just Like That.

Today is Racial Justice Sunday... and we look with thanksgiving for ground gained, and with hope for a more equal justice still to come.

Martin Luther King wrote

***We must accept finite disappointment,
but never lose infinite hope***

Life teaches us that there is much brokenness. So how dare we hope? Hope is founded on experience. Our lived experience is that Jesus has shown himself selflessly pouring himself out in every human situation, working within for life. Why do we hope? Because we know his power to deliver. It's like labour pains, says S. Paul. Life birthed from darkness. In this we hope.

When life brings storms, we focus our gaze on Jesus, who will get us through, and we hope - defiantly. For hope tells us that what is good and life-giving will endure, and will win through, in the Grace and Strength of God. And we proclaim that hope as a light into a world struggling through darkness

For, as S. Paul says – who hopes for what is seen? But, nonetheless, by hope we are saved.
