Eco Tip of the week

Did you know that in the UK, less than 50% of our waste is recycled!

Recycling is more than just plastic

1. Food Recycling - Each year we create 7 million tonnes of food waste from our homes. If thrown in the bin and sent to landfill, this waste releases methane - a green house gas 25 times more potent than CO₂. By sending it to recycling instead, reduces its environmental impact and enables the food to be turned into soil fertiliser or even a source of energy.

2. WEEE Recycling - WEEE stands for Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment. WEEE is the UK's fastest growing waste stream and small WEEE products can be collected as part of the bin collection. Large appliances can be dropped off at the recycling centre. Recycling the WEEE waste means that the metals and materials can be recovered and reused.
