### **Bishop of Manchester to retire in Summer 2027**

The Bishop of Manchester, the Rt Revd Dr David Walker, has announced that he will retire in the summer of 2027. Bishop David shared the news this week in this pastoral letter to clergy, lay leaders, and congregations across the Diocese of Manchester:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,


Many of you will be aware that in 2027 I reach my 70th birthday. To avoid speculation, and to minimise the gap between my retirement and the arrival of the next Bishop of Manchester, I wish to set out my intentions as early as possible. I am pleased to be able to tell you that I have now heard that His Majesty the King has agreed to my retirement. Further to this, last week I received a signed Declaration from the Archbishop of York declaring that the See of Manchester will become vacant as from 31st July 2027. In making this Declaration, the Archbishop has confirmed that I can continue for what will be two months beyond my actual birthday. This is to allow me, amongst other things, to preside at the Petertide Ordinations, and to relinquish my responsibilities at a point when things calm down for the summer holidays.

Until then, I intend to remain fully engaged in the service of Manchester Diocese as your bishop. There will be a time for formal farewells to be made, but it is not yet for a while!

Please continue to hold Sue and me in your prayers, as I hold you all in mine.

### RECYCLE FOR CHARITY

As part of our recycling mission, we are collecting tools for the charity **Tools With A Mission**.

TTWAM is a Christian charity that collects unwanted usable tools, refurbishes them, and then sells them to local job seekers in the developing world for livelihood creation. We have five local groups across the country formed by volunteers, and we are supported by seven independent trustees, including Men's Sheds.

Locally, we provide volunteering opportunities to older persons who struggle with loneliness and isolation after retirement, as well as opportunities for people with physical and learning disabilities and support for community groups and refugees. We work with organisations offering skills training and experience to young people with additional needs and preparing them for employment. We have also provided tools to local community groups in the UK who use them in projects for people with special needs.

If you would like to donate your unwanted, but still useful tools, please check the list on the information leaflet for the types of tools that are accepted and those that aren't.

At Men's, Radcliffe will be the collection centre and hand tools and smaller items can be brought to the Tool Group meetings along with other recycling, but we kindly request that any larger items are brought to the church on the first Sunday of the month between 11am and 12.30pm.

Builders' tools - levels, sledgehammers, bolsters, chisels, all types of hammers and trowels, pin and lines, tape measures, hacksaws and blades, utility knife blades
