Reflection

A shepherd's life was harsh and dangerous as he defended his sheep from thieves, bad weather or wild animals threatened as he slept with the sheep often acting as a gate to the sheep pen. We cannot imagine the perils which the shepherd faced and the courage it took to be out in the dark and in all weathers. Shepherds were not necessarily welcomed in polite society they were often rough and ready characters who lived out on the margins, quite literally. Psalm 23 'The Lord is my shepherd' emphasises a softer view of the shepherd. The image depicts the care and protection of God for his people but also the blessings which come from keeping close to

'the shepherd' and not going astray. Jesus described himself as 'the good shepherd' who had come for all those who will listen to his voice and follow him. The shepherd walked ahead of his sheep and the sheep followed behind, we have the reassurance that Jesus goes ahead of us into unanticipated or unknown circumstances and situations. How well do we know the voice of the Shepherd and are we following it?

1st Reading: Acts 2.42–end

They devoted themselves to the
apostles' teaching and fellowship, to
the breaking of bread and the prayers.

Awe came upon everyone, because
many wonders and signs were being
done by the apostles. All who believed
were together and had all things in
common; they would sell their
possessions and goods and distribute
the proceeds to all, as any had need.
Day by day, as they spent much time
together in the temple, they broke
bread at home and ate their food with
glad and generous hearts, praising God
and having the goodwill of all the
people. And day by day the Lord added
to their number those who were being
saved.

2nd Reading: 1 Peter 2.19–end

For it is to your credit if, being aware
of God, you endure pain while
suffering unjustly. If you endure when
you are beaten for doing wrong,
where is the credit in that? But if you
endure when you do right and suffer
for it, you have God's approval. For to
this you have been called, because
Christ also suffered for you, leaving
you an example, so that you should
follow in his steps.

'He committed no sin,
and no deceit was found in his
mouth.'

When he was abused, he did not
return abuse; when he suffered, he did
not threaten; but he entrusted himself
to the one who judges justly. He
himself bore our sins in his body on

the cross, so that, free from sins, we
might live for righteousness; by his
wounds you have been healed. For
you were going astray like sheep, but
now you have returned to the
shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Gospel: John 10.1–10

Glory to you, O Lord

'Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does
not enter the sheepfold by the gate
but climbs in by another way is a thief
and a bandit. The one who enters by
the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.
The gatekeeper opens the gate for
him, and the sheep hear his voice. He
calls his own sheep by name and leads
them out. When he has brought out all
his own, he goes ahead of them, and
the sheep follow him because they
know his voice. They will not follow a
stranger, but they will run from him
because they do not know the voice of
strangers.' Jesus used this figure of
speech with them, but they did not
understand what he was saying to
them.

So again Jesus said to them, 'Very
truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the
sheep. All who came before me are
thieves and bandits; but the sheep did
not listen to them. I am the gate.
Whoever enters by me will be saved,
and will come in and go out and find
pasture. The thief comes only to steal
and kill and destroy. I came that they
may have life, and have it abundantly.
Praise to you, O Christ
