Eco Tip of the week

Spring showers may be miserable for us, but they are great for the garden!

1. Harvest rain water - Make the most of April showers by collecting them in a rain water harvester. Use this to water your garden and plants, and help to reduce your bill and carbon footprint whilst also conserving water reserves.

2. Be Bee Friendly - Bees are essential for our crops and our economy (pollinating 80% of wildflowers and providing at least £1.8 billion to the UK economy through pollinating our crops); but their populations have fallen due pesticides and loss of habitat. Do your bit by providing a source of water and bee friendly plants in your garden (such as lavender, crocus and marjoram). You could even consider letting your grass grow a little longer and building a bee "hotel" out of bamboo sticks.
