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Eco Tip of the week

This Wednesday, 22 April, is Earth Day. See how you can reduce your environmental impact

1. Reduce plastic waste - try to reduce your consumption of single use plastic by giving up straws, plastic bags and using bar soap and shampoo, reusable coffee cups and water bottles. This Earth day cut down on your plastic and encourage others to do the same.
