Eco Tip of the week

With summer just around the corner, make the most of the fun in the sun while reducing your environmental impact:

- 1. Biodegradable Glitter** - Many people are unaware that most glitter is made out of plastic and, once washed down the drain, glitter becomes another single use micro plastic pollutant that harms marine life for hundreds of years. However, there are biodegradable alternatives that are available.
- 2. Eco-friendly Sun Cream** - Sun cream is not included in the ban on sales of products containing microbeads, which only applies to rinse off products. Sun creams can further harm the environment as they often contain Oxybenzone which contributes to coral bleaching and is toxic to other marine life. Fortunately, there are eco alternatives available to help you protect your skin and marine life.
