The disciples had to wait three days after the crucifixion to discover that death was not the cruel end of Jesus' life and mission but part of a new beginning for everyone and all creation. You can't hold your breath for ten days and that's how long they had to wait until the Holy Spirit came to take everything to a new level. To help us experience this period as a time of prayer and anticipation, we are offering copies of 'Thy Kingdom Come' booklets written by Archbishop Sarah Mullally. With a reflection for each day, the encouragement is to pray for five people every day in eager anticipation that they may experience a touch from God.
