Eco Tip of the week

How you can reduce your impact with what you have delivered?

1. Glass Bottled Milk - 5.5 billion litres of milk are produced in the UK each year, 97% of which is packaged in plastic bottles! You can reduce the impact of your milk consumption by replacing the plastic bottles with glass, which can be reused up to 25 times before being recycled. Search online for glass bottled milk delivery services.

2. Avoid Mail - On average, each letter thrown away is worth around 30 gCO₂e and the average unwanted catalogue has a much larger footprint as they are delivered wrapped in plastic. You can prevent this unwanted post by simply asking the supplier to stop sending them. In addition, why not go paperless and ask for your statements, bills and newsletters to be sent by email or be made available online.
