Reflection

If I were to be asked what the job of a theologian is, I would reply that it is to try to push to the limits what we can intelligibly say about God. On Trinity Sunday I often feel a great deal of sympathy for the first disciples. Being Jews, they were firm believers in the one true God. But then they met Jesus, and began to recognise that he was part of what they meant by God. And then they encountered the Holy Spirit, who was also God. We see this clearly in our Gospel reading when Jesus tells the disciples to baptize "in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit."

It has been said that the best definition of the Trinity is in the Athanasian Creed, but, as the writer put it, only because it contradicts itself clause by clause. If nothing else this underlines the mystery of the Trinity.

As Christians, like the Jews before us, we too believe in one, true God. Trinity Sunday reminds us that, ultimately, God is beyond our understanding. Fortunately we have the revelation which Jesus gives. Contemplating Jesus will not give us a comprehensive understanding of the Trinity, but it will assure us that God has given us a good enough picture of who he is in Jesus.

Like the white queen in 'Alice through the looking glass' we may need to learn to believe six impossible things before breakfast!!

May God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit bless, preserve and keep you, now and evermore.
