Background to the Gospel

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next, however, are designated as solemnities—special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today on Trinity Sunday we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity, one God in three persons. Today’s Gospel is from the beginning of John’s Gospel. The passage we read follows Jesus’ conversation with a Pharisee, Nicodemus, about what it means to be born of both water and the spirit. Nicodemus approaches Jesus at night and acknowledges Jesus as a teacher from God. Jesus tells him that only those who are born from above will see the Kingdom of God. Nicodemus misunderstands and questions how a person can be born more than once. Jesus tells Nicodemus that no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. Jesus is essentially explaining Baptism, which we celebrate as a sacrament today. Yet Nicodemus, we are told, still does not understand what Jesus is saying. Jesus continues by testifying to the need to be born from above so that one might have eternal life.

After the dialogue with Nicodemus, the author of the Gospel offers his own explanation of Jesus’ words. This is what we read in today’s Gospel, John 3:16-18.

In the context of today’s focus on the mystery of the Holy Trinity, the reading calls our attention to the action of God, who reveals himself in three persons: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. God the Father, out of love for the world, sent his Son into the world in order to save it. Through the death and resurrection of the Son, we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit. As three persons, God acts always as a God of love; he does not condemn the world but acts to save it.

The Gospel also calls attention to the response that is required of us. God’s love for us calls us to respond in faith by professing our belief in God’s son, Jesus, and the salvation that he has won for us. This profession of faith is a sign of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

Restoration Project Update

Worksop Priory PCC is pleased to report that the first phase of our grant funded investigation into the building's drainage issues, roof and tower leaks, and areas of deteriorating masonry is now well underway. Although much of this work happens quietly behind the scenes, it marks an important step in caring for our historic church.

In March, a full **measured survey** of the Priory was completed. This provides highly accurate drawings of the building's layout and structure, forming the essential foundation for planning any future repairs or conservation work.

An **ecology survey** has also taken place. These surveys ensure that any building work protects the wildlife that shares our church, particularly bats, which often roost in historic buildings. Understanding what species are present helps us plan responsibly and meet all legal requirements.

More recently, both **drainage** and **asbestos surveys** have been carried out. The drainage survey used specialist CCTV equipment to examine the underground pipework and identify any blockages, leaks, or structural issues that may be contributing to water problems. The asbestos survey ensures that any asbestos containing materials are identified and safely managed before repair work begins, protecting both people and the building.

In the coming weeks, **scaffolding will be erected around the tower** so specialists can investigate the source of the leaks more closely and determine the repairs required. This will be the first visible sign of the project progressing.

We are also working closely with a **heritage consultant**, who is helping us prepare a bid for a larger capital works grant. As part of this, we are exploring how the Priory's rich heritage can be shared more widely through community engagement and consultation. We will be seeking input from as many people as possible, and your involvement will be greatly valued.

Further updates will follow as the project continues to unfold.

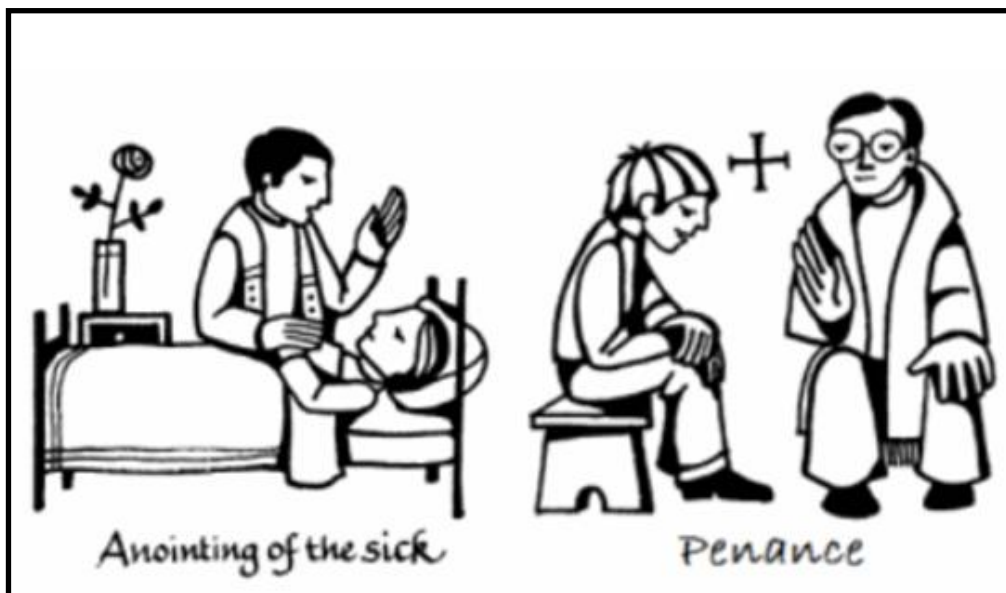
BAPTISM BOOKINGS AT PRIORY

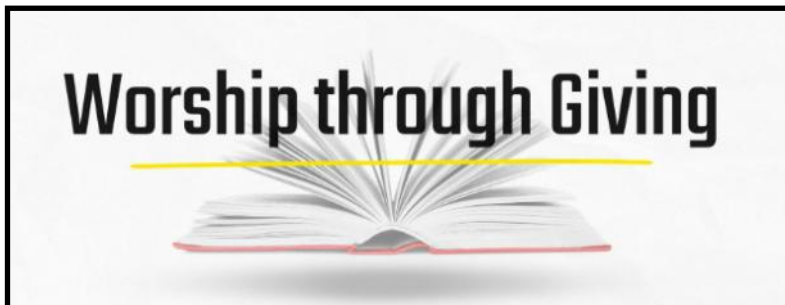
For convenience there is also a card machine in the Priory which can be used for donations or regular payments.

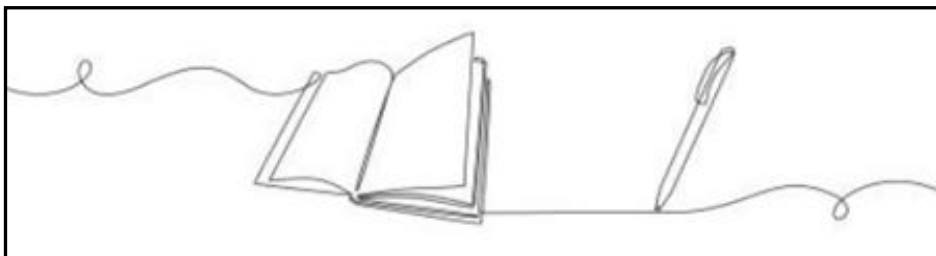
If you wish to continue to put cash in the collection plate each week, gift aid envelopes are only required for amounts over £30.

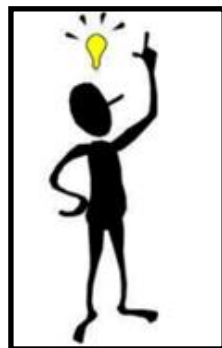

If you prefer to liaise by email, please make that clear too.

We will endeavour to respond within 48 hours.

There may be occasions when our Safeguarding Officer is not available.
