Eco Tip of the week

Instead of throwing things away, why not reduce your environmental impact by choosing a "waste not want not" ideology:

- 1. Buy Recycled** - Buying products made from recycled materials helps to reduce your demand for resources, contributes to a more circular economy and reduces your carbon footprint. Just look online when you come to buy a new item and see what options there are to reduce your footprint.
- 2. Upcycle** - When an item has lived out its use, consider upcycling it. It doesn't have to be a complicated project, just look online for ideas. For example, turn old mugs into candle holders, old containers into plant pots or decorative storage containers, and spruce up old furniture. Half term may be coming to an end but upcycling can also be a fun way to engage your kids. Giving new life to old items, saves money and reduces your demand on resources.
