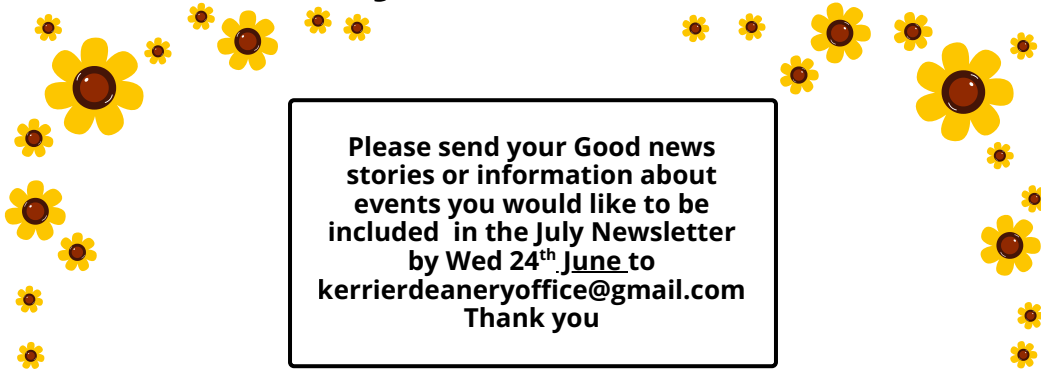

DEANERY BRIEFING

1. The hearing for the Proposed Pastoral Scheme for the Kerrier Team Ministry was held on Wednesday 13 May. The Church Commissioners have not yet published their decision. We are advised that this might be soon, or (perhaps more likely), some weeks away. When the outcome is known and is public, Heidi will write to all our PCCs and all our ministers.
2. House for duty: the post is now readvertised: closing date for applications is 17th August.

Café Church at St. Mawgan Church

on 21st June at 11.15am

with the Rural Dean!

Recently we have been hearing more about Café Church in the Deanery and elsewhere so in April Mawgan Churchwardens, Pauline and Lindsay, went along to the café church service which was being held at Landewednack Church. Having liked what we experienced we asked Rev'd Heidi if we could try it at Mawgan. Below is more information about the format.

What is café church?

Café church is a Sunday service, but with a more informal feel.

It usually takes place in a chapel space, with the congregation sitting in a relaxed circle and, as the name suggests, we'll start with coffee, tea and pastries!

What happens during café church?

Revd Heidi will lead the service, and we will sing a hymn (whilst remaining seated), spend some time reading a Bible passage, with Heidi providing some reflection on that and any events which may be pressing in the news. Another hymn may be sung, and then they'll be a time for people to reflect quietly on someone they wish to pray for. Heidi will collect those prayers together with a prayer for the day. A poem may be shared, and there is usually an opportunity for questions about God, the Church or life in general.

How long does café church last?

No longer than an hour.

What do we do if we have questions about the forthcoming service?

Speak to Lindsay and Pauline and they'll be able to ask Heidi for more details.

Still not sure?

Why not come along to the first café church service on June 21st at 11.15am at St Mawgan Church to see for yourself?!
