

**Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus
Christ according to St. Matthew
28.16-end**

Now the eleven disciples went to
Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus
had directed them. When they saw him,
they worshipped him; but some
doubted. And Jesus came and said to
them, ‘All authority in heaven and on
