FIRST READING

(Isaiah 40.12-17. 27-end)

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah:
Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, or with
the breadth of his hand marked off the heavens? Who has held
the dust of the earth in a basket, or weighed the mountains on
the scales and the hills in a balance? Who can fathom the Spirit of
the Lord, or instruct the Lord as his counsellor? Whom did
the Lord consult to enlighten him, and who taught him the right
way? Who was it that taught him knowledge, or showed him the
path of understanding? Surely the nations are like a drop in a
bucket; they are regarded as dust on the scales; he weighs the
islands as though they were fine dust. Lebanon is not sufficient
for altar fires, nor its animals enough for burnt offerings. Before
him all the nations are as nothing; they are regarded by him as
worthless and less than nothing. Why do you complain, Jacob?
Why do you say, Israel, "My way is hidden from the Lord; my
cause is disregarded by my God"? Do you not know? Have you
not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the
ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his
understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the
weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow
tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall, but those who
hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on
wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will
walk and not be faint.

This is the word of the Lord.

(2 Corinthians 13-11-end)

A reading from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians;
Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you
may grow up in your Finally, brothers and sisters, rejoice! Strive
for full restoration, encourage one another, be of one mind, live
in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you.
Greet one another with a holy kiss. All God's people here
send their greetings. May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ,
and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be
with you all.

(Matthew 28.16-20)

Alleluia, alleluia. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and
the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die,
they shall live, and everyone who lives and believes in
me will never die."

given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all
nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the
Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey
everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with

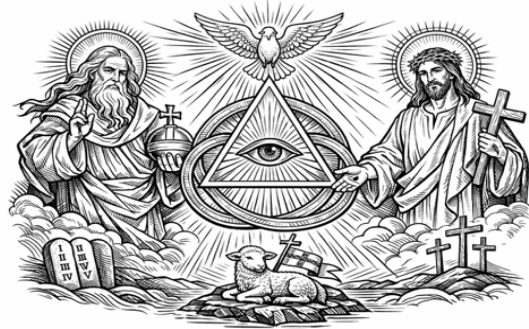
NOTICES FOR SUNDAY 31st MAY
