## **Low carbon holidays**

**1. Travel** - International travel accounts for around 1 GtCO<sub>2</sub>e each year in carbon emissions! Flights make up the majority, so try reducing your time in the air by considering a "staycation" or travelling shorter distances. If you are traveling within Europe, why not make the most of the trains, ferries and coaches to get to and around your destination. Whilst on holiday, think about using public transport or cycling. If you do fly, why not compensate for your emissions through offsetting?

**2. Accommodation** - To ensure that you limit your emissions, why not search for eco-accommodations which source local, in season food and use renewable energy. You could even opt for camping during your staycation to truly limit the carbon footprint of your holiday.
