Eco Tip of the week

*Make the most of your garden to improve
your self sufficiency and your environmen-
tal footprint:*

1. Grow your own - By growing even a
little of your own produce decreases your
foods transport distance, reduces the need
for plastic packaging and the amount of
land needed to grow the produce else-
where. Don't let lack of space prevent you,
certain crops can be grown in pots on
even the smallest patios or windowsills.

2. Compost - Another way to make the
most of your garden is by composting.
When sent to landfill, food waste produces
methane, a greenhouse gas 25 times
more potent than carbon dioxide. Addition-
ally, composting supplies you with free
fertiliser that you can use in your garden to
help your plants prosper and grow.
