FIRST READING

Jeremiah 28.5-9

A reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah.

Then the prophet Jeremiah spoke to Hananiah the prophet in the presence of the priests and all the people who were standing in the house of the Lord, and the prophet Jeremiah said, "Amen! May the Lord do so; may the Lord make the words that you have prophesied come true, and bring back to this place from Babylon the vessels of the house of the Lord, and all the exiles. Yet hear now this word that I speak in your hearing and in the hearing of all the people. The prophets who preceded you and me from ancient times prophesied war, famine, and pestilence against many countries and great kingdoms. As for the prophet who prophesies peace, when the word of that prophet comes to pass, then it will be known that the Lord has truly sent the prophet."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

Psalm 89.8-18

SECOND READING

Romans 6.12-23

A reading from the letter of Saint Paul
to the Romans.

Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to
make you obey its passions. Do not present your
members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness,
but present yourselves to God as those who have

been brought from death to life, and your members to
God as instruments for righteousness. For sin will
have no dominion over you, since you are not under
law but under grace. What then? Are we to sin
because we are not under law but under grace? By no
means! Do you not know that if you present
yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are
slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which
leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to
righteousness? But thanks be to God, that you who
were once slaves of sin have become obedient from
the heart to the standard of teaching to which you
were committed, and, having been set free from sin,
have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking
in human terms, because of your natural limitations.
For just as you once presented your members as
slaves to impurity and to lawlessness leading to more
lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves
to righteousness leading to sanctification. For when
you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to
righteousness. But what fruit were you getting at that
time from the things of which you are now ashamed?
For the end of those things is death. But now that you
have been set free from sin and have become slaves
of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its
end, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the
free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

This is the word of the Lord.

GOSPEL

Matthew 10.40-42

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to the twelve: "Whoever receives you
receives me, and whoever receives me receives him
who sent me. The one who receives a prophet
because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's
reward, and the one who receives a righteous person
because he is a righteous person will receive a
righteous person's reward. And whoever gives one of
these little ones even a cup of cold water because he
is a disciple, truly, I say to you, he will by no means
lose his reward."
