## First Reading

### ROMANS 5.1-8

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person – though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

## What will be coming next after Alpha?

Thank you to everyone who attended or helped and supported our recent Alpha course. We had a great time and as we finished we asked people the simple question: 'What is next?'. Quite a few said they would like something that would focus on learning about the Bible in both a small and larger setting.

In response to this we are planning a larger group size course for everyone in September using videos from the popular tv show 'The Chosen' as the basis for discussions on the Bible, and we will be sharing more about this nearer the time.

## Gospel Reading

### MATTHEW 9.35-10.8

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.' Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him. These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

## "Don't step on a Bee Day" Friday 10th July–

Offers more than just a gentle reminder to watch where you walk. It's a call to action to protect one of nature's most vital pollinators. Bees are essential to our food Systems, ecosystems and biodiversity. Don't Step on a Bee Day was created by Thomas and Ruth Roy, who are known for establishing various quirky and meaningful observances. While the exact year of inception is unclear, the day has gained traction over the years, especially in the United Kingdom and the United States. Initially, it served as a reminder to be cautious of bees to avoid stings. Over time, it evolved into a broader campaign. All Saints Annesley will be celebrating this event.
