Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." John 3:5-8

CLERGY THOUGHTS

PENTECOST: WHEN THE HOLY SPIRIT DETONATED A GLOBAL MOVEMENT

The city was occupied by an imperial power, rebel groups were active, religious and political leaders squabbled... Jerusalem had become a place of fear and persecution for the early believers. Yet what looked like disaster became the very thing God used to propel the Gospel outward into the world like centrifuge. After persecution broke out, "those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went" (Acts 8:4). The pressure in Jerusalem pushed ordinary disciples beyond locked rooms and familiar streets, carrying the message of Christ into Judea, Samaria, and eventually across the globe.

Nearly 2,000 years later, we celebrate the birth of this, unlikely movement we call the Church: billions of ordinary, flawed, grace-filled people trying to follow Jesus Christ.

Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit does not necessarily make people cleverer — she makes us bolder.

Before Pentecost, Peter denied even knowing Jesus (Luke 22:54–62). Afterwards, filled with the Spirit, he stood publicly and proclaimed Christ to the crowds in Jerusalem (Acts 2:14). Peter had not suddenly become more educated or polished. The difference was courage. As Saint Paul later wrote, "God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power and love and self-control" (2 Timothy 1:7).

Do you need to hear that today?

We often think we are unqualified to speak about faith. Yet most of us are not looking for experts; we are looking for hope, honesty, and authenticity. Sometimes all it takes is one conversation:

“This is where I found peace.”

“This is why I still pray.”

“This is how God carried me.”

Scripture says we should “always be prepared to give an answer... for the hope that is in you” (1 Peter 3:15). Not aggressively or perfectly — simply truthfully.

As is humanity, the Church is far from perfect. There are chapters in Christian history that rightly grieve us deeply. There have been failures, abuses, hypocrisies, and sins that demand honesty, repentance, and humility. Yet still the Church of Jesus Christ still feeds the hungry, builds hospitals and schools, inspires exceptional artwork, and continues to challenge global injustice.

The Holy Spirit propels us. She gives confidence where there’s hesitation and words when we fear we have none, all we need to do is receive her.

Some additional thoughts from Charlotte on her piece in Clergy Thoughts:

Why Do Some Christians Refer to the Holy Spirit as “She”?

Some readers may notice that Christians occasionally refer to the Holy Spirit using feminine language. This is not an attempt to change Christian doctrine but arises from some ancient biblical and theological traditions surrounding the Holy Spirit.

In the Old Testament, the Hebrew word most often used for Spirit is *ruach* (רוּחַ), meaning “breath,” “wind,” or “spirit.” Grammatically, *ruach* is a feminine noun in Hebrew. For example, in Genesis 1:2, “the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters,” the word used is *ruach Elohim*.

Similarly, in parts of the ancient Syriac Christian tradition — one of the oldest expressions of Christianity — the word for Spirit (*ruha*) is also grammatically feminine. Some early Christian writers in Syriac-speaking churches therefore naturally used maternal or feminine imagery when speaking about the Holy Spirit.

At the same time, the New Testament was written in Greek, where the word for Spirit, *pneuma* (πνεῦμα), is grammatically neuter. In some passages, however, masculine pronouns are used because of the personal nature of the Spirit described by Jesus (for example John 14:26).

Classical Christian theology has therefore generally taught that God transcends human sex and gender altogether. God is neither male nor female in a biological sense. Scripture itself uses both paternal and maternal imagery for God: a father who teaches and protects (Matthew 6:9), but also a mother who comforts and gathers her children (Isaiah 66:13; Matthew 23:37).

So, when some Christians refer to the Holy Spirit as “She,” they are drawing upon ancient linguistic roots and biblical imagery, not claiming that God is literally female. Others prefer “He,” following traditional English convention and many church liturgies. Both approaches seek to honour the mystery of the Spirit who, like the wind itself, cannot be contained by human categories.

As Jesus says: “The wind blows wherever it pleases... So it is with everyone born of the Spirit” (John 3:8).

CURATES' CORNER

I find it hard to believe that it is nearly a year since I was ordained deacon, and Charlotte ordained priest. In just a few weeks' time, I too shall be priested. During the service, Bishop Jonathan will lay his hands upon our heads, praying for the gift of the Holy Spirit and conferring the grace and authority needed for priestly ministry. Through this ancient act, those ordained are set apart for service in Christ's Church and connected through an unbroken line to the ministry of the apostles themselves.

It feels especially fitting to be writing this at Pentecost, when we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles in wind and flame. Those first followers, once uncertain and afraid, were filled with courage, joy and purpose, and sent out to proclaim the good news of Christ to the world. Pentecost reminds us that the Church is sustained not by human strength alone, but by the life and power of the Holy Spirit.

Ordination is not simply the beginning of a new role, but part of the same continuing story that began at Pentecost. The Spirit who inspired and sustained the apostles still guides and renews the Church today. Within our benefice, we all share in that calling: to listen for the Spirit's voice, to encourage one another in faith, and to bear witness to God's love in our community and beyond.

BRIGHSTONE CE AIDED PRIMARY SCHOOL

Honey Bee class managed to dodge the showers and enjoyed a lovely visit to the Royal IW Agricultural Show Education Day. They began with a tractor and trailer ride to the woodland area to meet Luke the Forester who showed them the axes and tools that he uses in his work (and his first aid kit!). They found out about trail biking opportunities on the island, made butter with Bridesford Farm Dairy and met and learned about cows, pigs, sheep, a pony, chickens, llamas and alpacas. They also had fun taking part in Hobby Horse relay races (obviously Mrs Northard had to join in with the gallop to make an even number!).



Last term, the school council asked the Gardening Club if they could make a digging pit for the children to use at break time. So, the gardeners set about reshaping the old pit to make it bigger and better.

Poppy, one of our gardeners, asked her dad if he had some wood to make a frame and he very kindly came up with some lengths of wood that were perfect for the job. The children measured up and, with the help of Mr Freeman, site manager, a frame was constructed. The school bought a bag of Island topsoil, and the pit is now fully operational. Who knows what might be discovered in their excavations??



Recently, in Art and Design, Bumble Bee children worked on their colour mixing skills. Their challenge was to make different shades of green, using the primary colours blue and yellow. They all did superbly and are now colour mixing experts! They also

finished their recounts of our trip to the Portsmouth Aquarium. There was some great use of time connectives, adjectives and conjunctions. Well done, team Bumble Bee!



Honey Bee class have been reading *The Wonder Garden* in English. Following a visit to the Dragon Tree, they created amazing descriptive information writing about it, in the style of *The Wonder Garden*.
