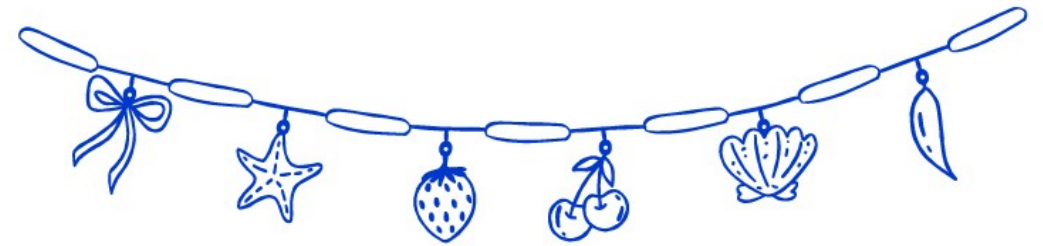

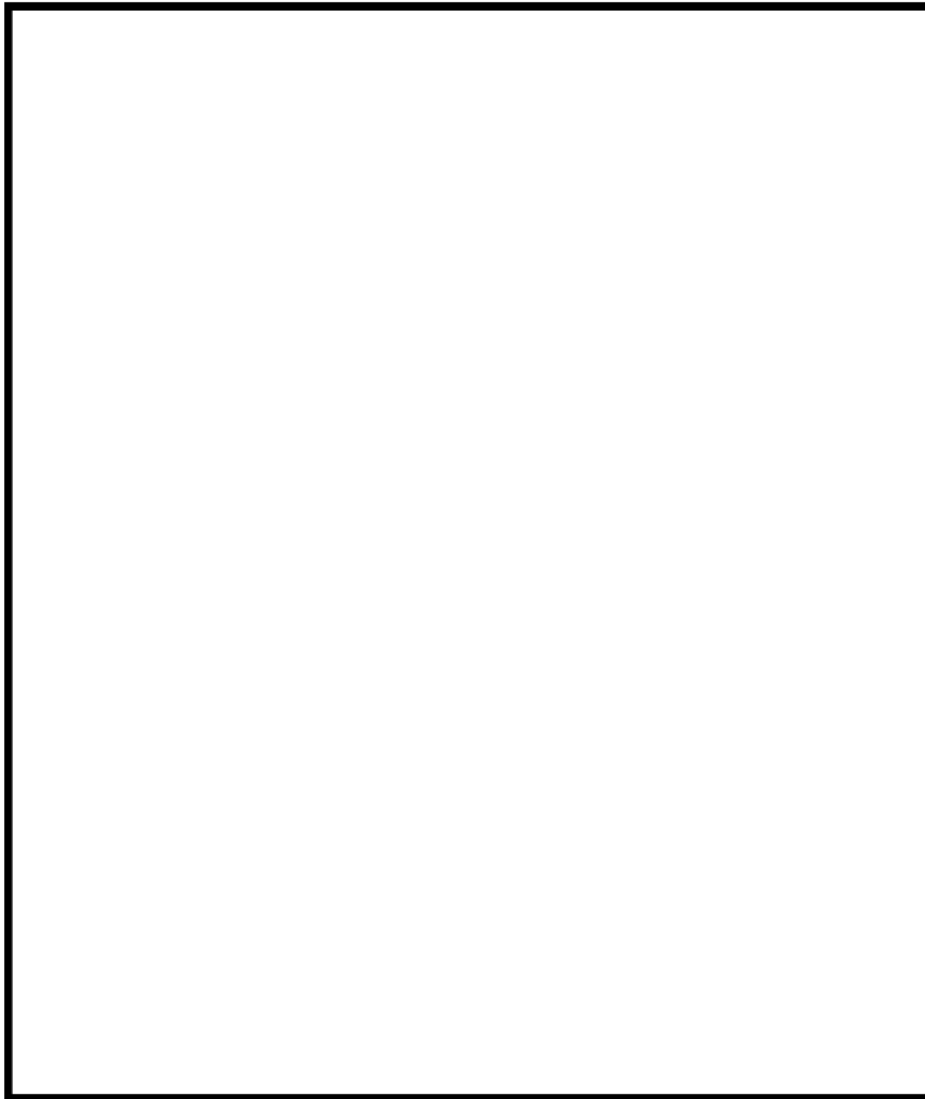
August break - There will be no Messy Church this month.



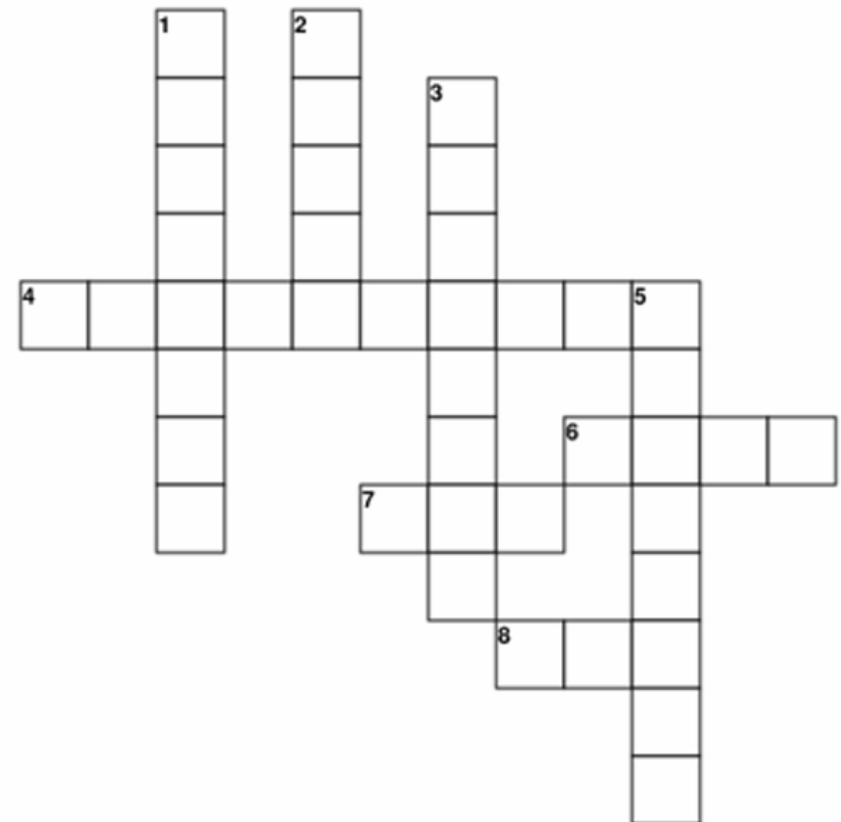
