Eco Tip of the week

Friday 5th June is World Environment Day. Here are some suggestions to help you do your bit.

1. Measure your plastic footprint - 13 million tonnes of plastic are leaked into the ocean each year and 50% of the plastic that we use is single use, meaning that simple changes in our behaviour can drastically reduce the amount of plastic pollution we each produce. By measuring your plastic footprint using an online calculator will help you to identify key sources of your plastic waste.

2. Make a pledge to reduce - Once you have worked out your plastic footprint, why not set a target of how much you are going to reduce and/or what single use plastics you are going to give up. By decreasing your plastic footprint you will be doing your bit to prevent pollution, protect wildlife, and reduce your carbon footprint and your demand on resources.
