Eco Tip of the week

Transport is responsible for 14% of global carbon emissions! What can we do?

1. Bike it - This week, the 9 -17 June, is Bike Week, so take inspiration and try to cycle instead of driving where possible. Going for a cycle ride is a fun and social low carbon activity for you to explore new areas and get some exercise. It's great for your health, reduces air pollution and traffic and saves you money.

2. Go Electric - When it's time to buy or lease a new car, look into going electric. Electric and plug in hybrid cars can significantly reduce your carbon emissions and being fuelled by electricity also makes them a lot cheaper to run. With fewer maintenance costs and additional tax savings and incentives, electric cars can also be more economically viable than you think.
