### TRINITY SUNDAY

This Sunday marks the beginning of Ordinary Season (see above). Trinity Sunday marks the very end of the liturgical cycle of the incarnation (Christmas), the resurrection (Easter), and the sending of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost)—Trinity Sunday represents our belief in God as the ultimate model for human community, by living in unity and diversity. Trinity Sunday sets the tone for the long, green season of Ordinary Time (or "Trinitytide"), which is meant for ongoing Christian growth.

### CORPUS CHRISTI

This is the Day of Thanksgiving for Holy Communion. We will celebrate the eucharistic rite as the central and sacramental heart of our faith in Christ by gathering together on Thursday 4 June at 10am in the Lady Chapel. (Please note that the Book Group will not meet that day).
