Call to Worship

Please stand as able at the entry of the ministers.

One: In the name of The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit.

Many: Amen

One: We come from scattered lives to meet with God.
Let us recognise God's presence with us.

A short time of quiet is kept

One: As God's people we have gathered

Many: Let us worship God together.

Welcome

We sit as we receive words of welcome, concluding with this prayer:

**Many: Almighty God
to whom all hearts are open,
all desires known,
and from whom no secrets are hidden:
cleanse the thoughts of our hearts
by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit,
that we may perfectly love you,
and worthily magnify your holy name;
through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Lighting of the Paschal Candle

Confession

We sit or kneel.

One: Human sin disfigures the whole creation,
which groans with eager longing for God's

First Reading: Romans 4:13-15

We sit as we listen to our first reading.

¹³ For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴ If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵ For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

¹⁶ For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, ¹⁷ as it is written, 'I have made you the father of many nations')—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸ Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become 'the father of many nations', according to what was said, 'So numerous shall your descendants be.' ¹⁹ He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already^[a] as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰ No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹ being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²² Therefore his faith 'was reckoned to him as righteousness.' ²³ Now the words, 'it was reckoned to him', were written not for his sake alone, ²⁴ but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord

from the dead, ²⁵ who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

⁹ As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, 'Follow me.' And he got up and followed him.

¹⁰ And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax-collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. ¹¹ When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, 'Why does your teacher eat with tax-collectors and sinners?' ¹² But when he heard this, he said, 'Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³ Go and learn what this means, "I desire mercy, not sacrifice." For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.'

¹⁸ While he was saying these things to them, suddenly a leader of the synagogue came in and knelt before him, saying, 'My daughter has just died; but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live.' ¹⁹ And Jesus got up and followed him, with his disciples. ²⁰ Then suddenly a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak, ²¹ for she said to herself, 'If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well.' ²² Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, 'Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well.' And instantly the woman was made well. ²³ When Jesus came to the leader's house and saw the flute-players and the crowd making a commotion, ²⁴ he said, 'Go away; for the girl is not dead but sleeping.' And they laughed at him. ²⁵ But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl got up. ²⁶ And the report of this spread throughout that district.

The Liturgy of Baptism

Jenni: We thank God for Eiora who has come to be baptized today. Christ loves her and welcomes her into the Church. Will you support Eiora on her journey of faith?

Jenni: Will you help Eiora to live and grow within God's family?

Many: We will.

Jenni addresses Eiora's parents and godparents

Jenni: God knows each of us by name and we are his. Parents and godparents, you speak for Eiora today. Will you pray for her, and help her to follow Christ?

Parents &

Godparents: We will.

Jenni: We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to God's call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin?

Parents &

Godparents: I do.

Jenni: Do you reject evil?

Parents &

Godparents: I do.

Jenni: Do you turn to Christ?

Parents &

Godparents: I do.

Jenni: Do you trust in Christ?

Parents &

Godparents: I do.

Signing with the Cross

Jenni: Eilora, Christ claims you as his own. Receive the sign of the cross. It is the mark of Christ.

Jenni makes the sign of the cross with holy oil on Eilora' forehead.

Jenni: Throughout your life may you bear the mark of Christ's love.

God created you for wonder and joy,
But there is darkness here too and suffering.
Christ came to show us the way of love that
transforms all.

Many: May you remain faithful to God to the end of your life.

Prayer over the water

Water is poured into the font.

Jenni: We praise you, loving Creator, for the gift of Jesus.
He was baptized in the River Jordan,

where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love. He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him. Now, life-giving God, we ask you to bless this water, that Elicia and all who are baptized in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. **Amen.**

Profession of Faith

We stand as able to affirm our faith.

Fran: Let us affirm together our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

Many: I believe and trust in God.

Fran: Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

Many: I believe and trust in God.

Fran: Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

Many: I believe and trust in God.

Fran: This is the faith of the Church.

**Many: This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.**

The Baptism

Eliora is baptised with water as these words are said;

Jenni: Eliora, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Jenni: May God who has received you by baptism into the Church, pour upon you the riches of God's grace that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by the anointing Spirit and come to the inheritance of the saints in heaven. **Amen.**

Welcome

Jenni: There is one God, one faith, one baptism:
by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

**Many: God receives you by baptism into the Church.
Children of God,
blessed in the Spirit,
welcome to the family of Christ.**

We welcome Eliora with a round of applause. Her stone is placed inside the font and certificates are given to the Godparents and parents.

WOMEN'S THEOLOGY

Mother Diane our curate and Mother Charlotte Gibson, who works for the diocese of Birmingham, run a Women's Theology Group fortnightly during term times. We meet on Thursday evening at St George's vicarage Edgbaston and on Friday morning at a cafe on Harborne High St. It's open to anyone who identifies as a woman and is 18 years of age

and over. It's ecumenical, which means people come from a variety of churches in the local area. No preparation is necessary and its suitable for all levels of knowledge and ability.
