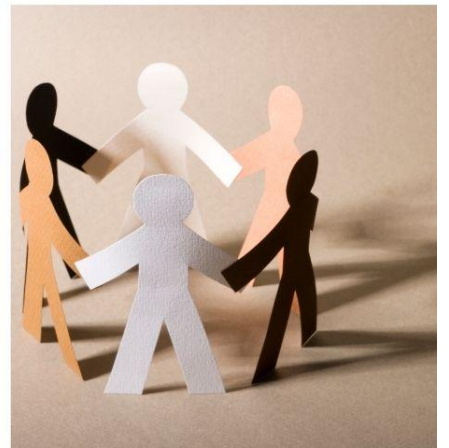

It was wonderful to see so many people at our Mission Community Spring Worship Event & to welcome Revd Phil Cansdale to speak; our theme was 'Joy' & our worship was certainly joyful! Hearing the inspiration behind each Church's choice of hymn was interesting & at times quite moving, and what a great line up of hymns we had. A huge thank you to Christ Church Ainsworth for hosting this event, to Jenny (Organist), members of CCA Choir who joined us on the evening, the 'home team' & all who helped with organising the event, and to everyone who came along & sang so enthusiastically on the night.

Ascension Day Prayer Journey 2026

After some rather wild & wet weather in the days leading up to this event, Ascension Day dawned dry & bright, if a little fresh! Following Celtic Morning Prayer, walkers set off from either end of the Mission Community, stopping at each Church on route for a time of prayer & finally coming together to celebrate Communion at St. Thomas & St. John, Radcliffe. Whilst it's definitely not a race – it's worth noting that, for the first time, the Northern walkers arrived at St. Thomas & St. John ahead of the Southern walkers! A big thank you to the team at St. Thomas & St. John for hosting us once again & to Revd Phil Cansdale for leading our Ascension Day Communion Service.

Recycling Update

Many thanks to everyone who continues to support our recycling initiatives; the small number of items that we each donate might seem insignificant, but just to let you know ... in May, 13.1kg of unwanted wax products were collected from Churches across the diocese; throughout 2025 our Mission Community collected almost 1,500 pairs of unwanted prescription glasses, multiple bags of bras, & just over 5kg of used stamps. Throughout 2025 the Bone Cancer Research Trust was able to raise £10,335-86 from the collection of used stamps. Recycling means that these items are not only being kept out of landfill; they are helping people in the UK and abroad who are in the greatest need.

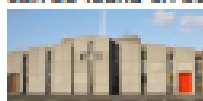
