31 May 2026 Trinity Sunday

Reading for this Sunday is: 1 Chronicles 29 v10 - 20

Gospel Reading: Matthew 20 v1-16

For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. ² After agreeing with the labourers for the usual daily wage,¹ he sent them into his vineyard. ³ When he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the market-place; ⁴ and he said to them, "You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right." So they went. ⁵ When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. ⁶ And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, "Why are you standing here idle all day?" ⁷ They said to him, "Because no one has hired us." He said to them, "You also go into the vineyard." ⁸ When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, "Call the labourers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first." ⁹ When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage. ¹⁰ Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual daily wage. ¹¹ And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, ¹² saying, "These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat." ¹³ But he replied to one of them, "Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? ¹⁴ Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. ¹⁵ Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?" ¹⁶ So the last will be first, and the first will be last.

REFLECTION

This Sunday, Trinity Sunday, we celebrate the Christian doctrine of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—three persons in one substance, an eternal community of love. The Trinity defies definition. When struggling with the Trinity, the early church theologians, the Church Fathers, used word “perichoresis”, or mutual indwelling or interpenetration to refer to the manner in which the three persons of the trinity relate to one another. The individuality of each of the persons is maintained whilst each shares in the life of the other two.

Ultimately, the Trinity is a mystery. By mystery I do not mean a riddle, or something that might be solved by a super sleuth in a detective novel, but rather mystery in the original sense of the word. The trinity is a mystery because the Trinity is a reality above our human comprehension. We will never understand it, but we live with the reality of the Trinity. It is a reality that we experience through scripture, worship, symbol and living out our faith. The theologian Cornelius Plantinga speaks of the Trinity as ‘a zestful, wondrous community of divine light, love, joy, mutuality and verve.’

Over the next four Sundays, in a series entitled ‘Generous God, Generous People’, we will be exploring God’s generosity to us – his grace and abundant provision for us and our call to be generous stewards of all that he has given us. We will be looking at being generous in our interactions with others, with our gifts, skills, time and with our finances. Jesus came that we might ‘have life and have it abundantly.’ (John 10:10b). God has indeed abundantly blessed us with all we have and gathered us together into his family of the church. We are called to share these riches with others and share the hope and peace that can only be found in Jesus Christ. I hope this series is an inspiration and encouragement to you!
