Jeremiah 28:5-9 Psalm 89:1-4,15-18	Romans 6:12-end	Matthew 10:40-end
Jeremiah addresses the false prophet Hananiah, warning that prophecies of peace will come to pass only when the Lord has sent a real prophet.	Paul urges his listeners not to succumb to sinful ways, since they are not under law but under grace. Former slaves to sin have become slaves of righteousness, and God's free gift is eternal life in Christ.	Jesus explains that anyone who welcomes one of his disciples receives Jesus himself and, by extension, his heavenly Father. Even the smallest gesture of kindness will be rewarded.

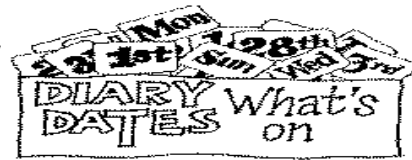

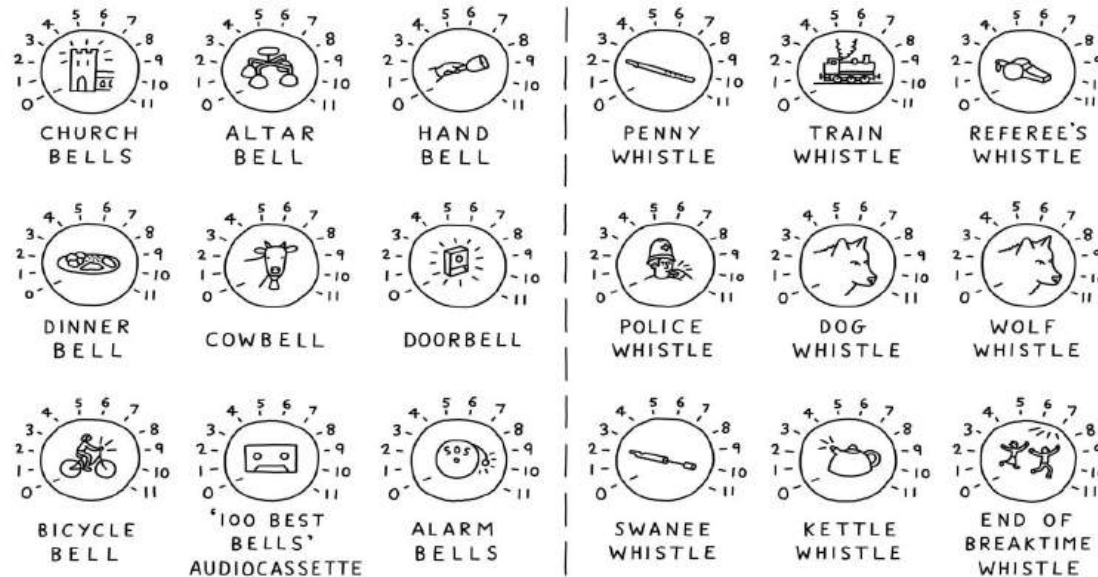
