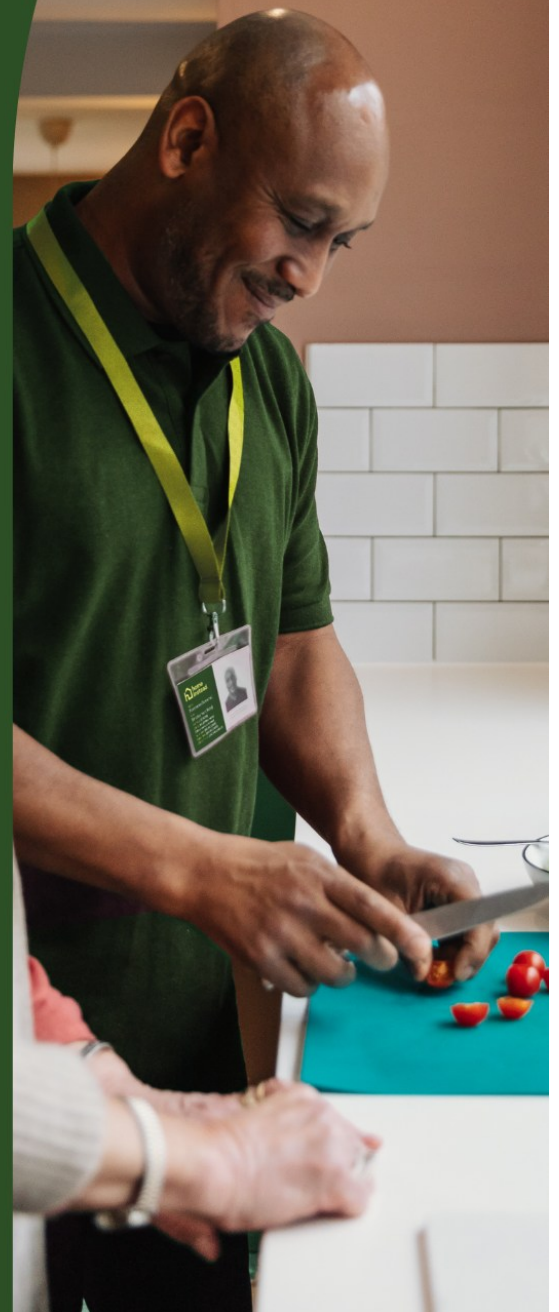

Stanley Mothers' Union Branch to be commissioned

On **Sunday 17th May, during the 10.45am morning communion service**, the new Stanley St Peter's branch of the Mothers' Union will officially be commissioned and dedicated. We expect quite a few members from other branches in the diocese to come along and support us. During the service, new members will also be admitted to membership of the Mothers' Union.

Up to now, our meetings have been taster sessions to explain about the work of the MU locally, nationally and internationally. In March, Rev Diane talked about the worldwide work that is being done to help families all round the world. We pored over a map of the world and shared world foods. In April, Sheila Crosby, from the Outwood branch, spoke about the work done locally in our area of Wakefield, within the diocese of Leeds.

With all this information and new knowledge, it is time to make up our minds whether to become full members or 'friends' of the MU. As a branch, we want to embrace the MU ethos of service initially within our locality. In our July meeting, two speakers will tell us about volunteering at New Hall prison, again to inform our decision about local service.



We are also hoping to have a MU banner for St Peter's finished in time for the special commissioning service. We visited many churches in Holy Week and found ourselves looking for the MU banners on display. Most were Victorian or early 20th century, very blue and with the Virgin Mary and her signature lilies. Ours will be very modern and simple, based on the logo reflecting the worldwide work of the Mothers' Union.

Next month, on **Wednesday 3rd June**, we have been invited to host a breakfast service for the intrepid cyclist who is taking a time capsule celebrating the 150 years of the MU from York to its burial in the grounds of Mary Sumner House in London. I think this could count towards our 'National Service'. We could be hosting a considerable party!

Please remember, membership of the Mothers' Union is open to all. It's not too late to come to one of our meetings. We meet at St Peter's on the last Thursday of the month at 1.30pm to share faith, fun and fellowship. Our next meeting will be **in church at 1.30pm on Thursday 28th May**. We would love to see you.

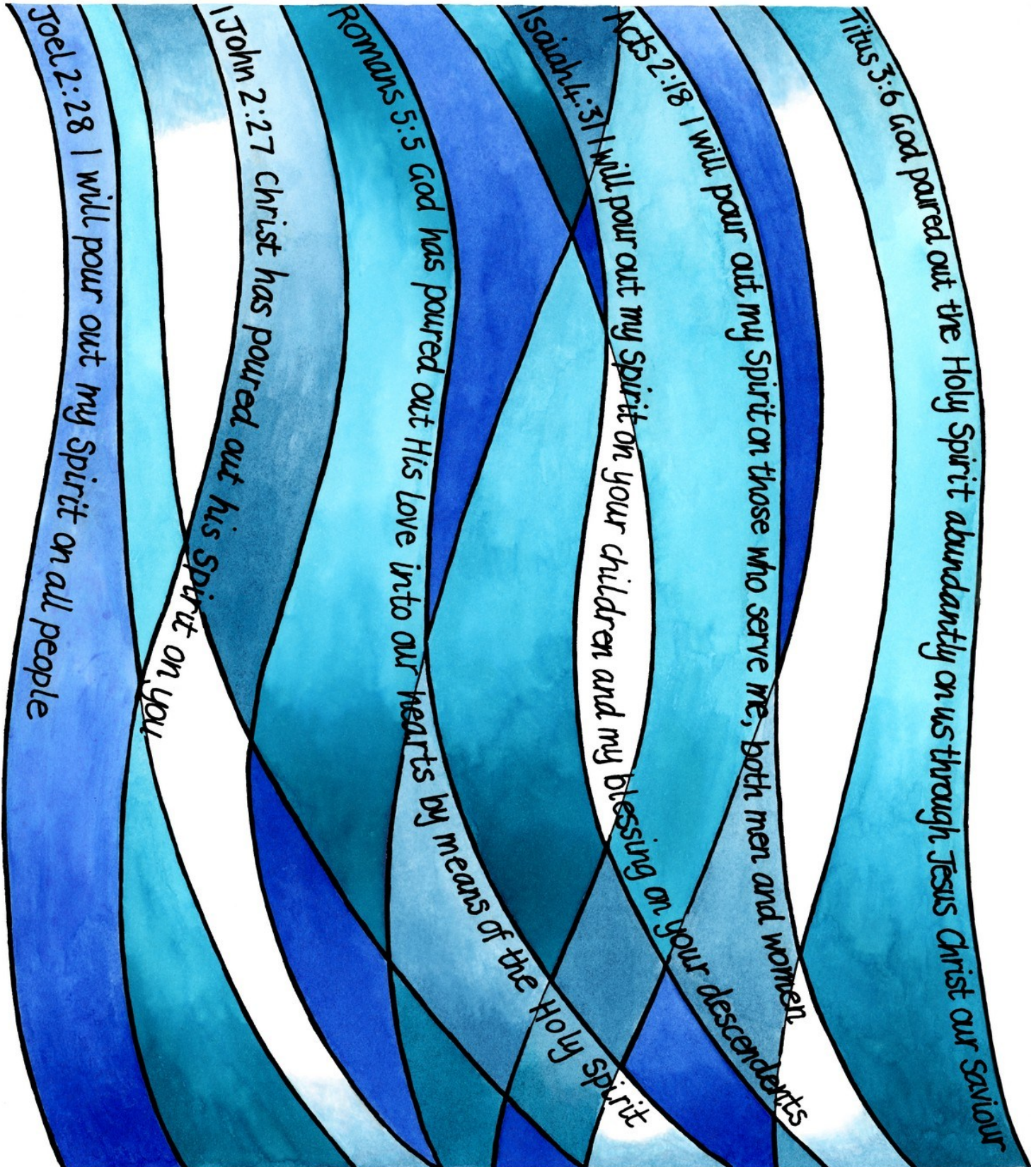

Dear Friends,

Jesus said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.” Matthew 9: 37-38

We're still in the season of Easter, in light of Christ's resurrection, I've been thinking about the theme of new hope. For the last couple of years we've been working hard to keep everything moving but in these months of spring as we see signs of new life in the world around us, there are also the first signs of new life in the benefice.

Having elected new PCCs in all four churches we are now beginning to build the vision for the benefice and the individual parishes as a whole. Over the next few months I will be working with each of the PCCs to discern who we are and where God is leading us. Then, when we gather the four PCCs and the Ministry Team together we can draw up a vision for the future and plans for the next steps.

In many ways that's what happened at Pentecost which is the end of the season of Easter. God's plan for Jesus' followers began to take shape with the coming of the Holy Spirit as wind and fire on the apostles gathered in the upper room. The people who had been following Jesus around the countryside were scattered to the corners of the Roman Empire. Initially that felt like a disaster but actually it was mission. God's vision had already come upon these followers and in being sent out they could put God's plan into action.



Within that though these men and women were also given the gifts they needed to do the jobs God was asking of them. In the same way we can expect that if we prayerfully and thoughtfully work with God and see where he is leading us we too will be given the gifts we need to move forwards.

Please be praying for your PCCs and Ministry Team as they work together to try to build this vision for the direction of the churches. Please also pray that we will listen well to each other and to God so that we can discern together the way forward. And finally please keep praying the mission prayer that we might see the people God is calling into our midst that we might share in the gifts he has given to them:

God of mission who alone brings growth to your church. Send your Holy Spirit to give vision to our planning; wisdom to our actions and power to our witness. Help our churches to grow in numbers, in spiritual commitment to you and in service to our local community through Christ our Lord. Amen.

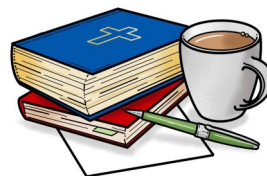

St Peter's, Clayworth

Recently, the church of St Peter's at Clayworth has been mentioned twice on Calendar news. Just north of Retford, it was built in the 12th century and the news items referred to the magnificent murals inside the church.

They were painted around 1905 by the renowned Scottish artist Phoebe Anne Traquair but are now in need of restoration due to the leeching of salts through the walls. There are only two examples of her work in England. An estimate of the cost of the work is around £200,000 which has now increased by 20% due to the government ceasing to make church repairs VAT free.

The other week Wendy and I decided to go and see the murals. They really are magnificent, and depict various scenes in the life of Christ and have not deteriorated too much. The trip takes about an hour, and once off the A1 you go through some pretty villages. We recommend a visit to see these inspiring murals and there is also a good pub/restaurant in the village called the Blacksmith's Arms. The post-code for your satnav is DN22 9AN.

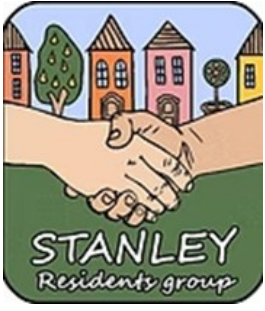
Promise of the Father

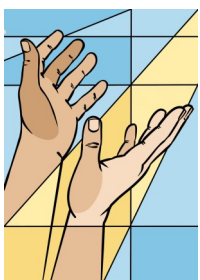
Community PACT meeting

Celebrating Pentecost

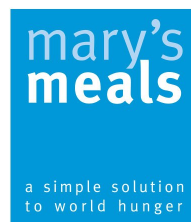
All our churches will be celebrating Pentecost on 24th May. Also known as 'Whitsun' or 'White Sunday', it takes place on the well-established Jewish festival of 'Firstfruits' at the beginning of the wheat harvest.

Pentecost is 50 days after Easter and marks a vital event in Christian history. After Jesus was crucified, his remaining followers, all 120 of them, were gathered in an upper room. They were afraid to show their faces for fear of arrest. But Jesus had told them that something big was going to happen. Jesus had plans for His disciples, but He knew they could not do the work themselves. They would need His help.

And so they waited, and prayed. Suddenly there was the sound of a rushing wind, tongues of flame flickered on their heads, and they began to praise God in many tongues. They burst on to the streets, preaching to people in their own languages. This was the birth of the world-wide Christian church.



We are still collecting foreign currency, or British coins and notes that are no longer legal tender, to give to Mary's Meals, who will turn them into meals for hungry school children.

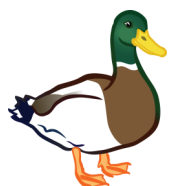


Mary's Meals provides school meals to 3 million children in some of the poorest countries in the world. A daily meal greatly improves a child's school attendance and achievements.

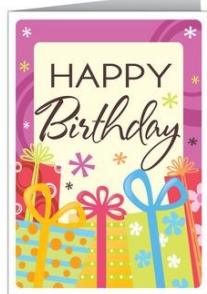

70 years of the Eurovision Song Contest—This year’s contest will be held from 12th—16th May in Vienna and will celebrate its 70th birthday. Britain has won Eurovision 5 times: in 1967 (Sandie Shaw), 1969 (Lulu), 1976 (Brotherhood of Man), 1981 (Bucks Fizz) and 1997 (Katrina and the Waves). This year the UK will be represented by the electronic music project ‘Look Mum No Computer’ with the song ‘Eins, Zwei, Drei’ inspired by retro-1980’s synth pop, and featuring a chorus sung partially in German—the first time a UK entry has not been sung entirely in English.
