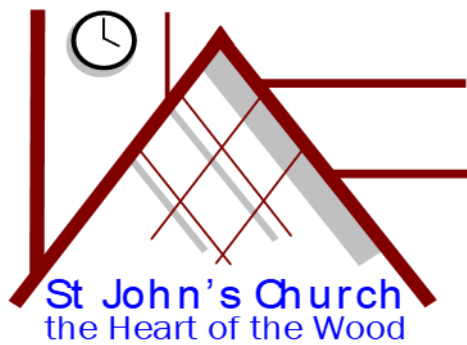

## A Few words from Revd. Lisa Mitchell

As I sit down to write this, I find myself wondering where the last few months have gone. They have been full, sometimes busy, occasionally challenging, but above all, they have been full of God's faithfulness.

One of the things I love most about parish ministry is that no two weeks are ever the same. One day I'm celebrating new life through baptism, another I'm walking alongside a family saying goodbye to someone they love. There are school assemblies filled with laughter, quiet moments of prayer, Sunday worship, cups of tea, community events, and countless conversations that often become holy moments when we least expect them.

Looking back over this term, I can't help but give thanks. Our Summer Fayre was a wonderful example of our church family and wider community coming together. Seeing so many people enjoying themselves reminded me that church is so much more than what happens inside our building on a Sunday morning. Every smile, every conversation, every act of generosity reflects something of God's love reaching out into our community.

I've also been so encouraged by the care shown for our churchyard. Thank you to everyone who has given their time to help maintain such a special place. As we begin to leave some areas a little wilder to encourage flowers, bees and butterflies, I'm reminded that the very first task God gave humanity was to care for creation. Looking after this beautiful space is another way of worshipping the Creator and offering a place of peace for all who visit.



This has also been a season of change. We have said thank you to Sharon and Jane for their faithful years of service as Churchwardens and welcomed Suzie into her new role. Change can sometimes make us feel uncertain, but throughout the Bible we see that God often does some of his best work when we are willing to step into something new. As I've prayed over these past few months, I keep returning to the words from Isaiah: "*See, I am doing a new thing!*" I believe God is gently leading us into a new season.

That new season isn't about changing for the sake of it. It's about asking where God is already at work and having the courage to join him there.

Jesus rarely waited for people to come to him. He met them where they were, on the shoreline, around a meal, walking along the road, or sitting under a tree. I wonder if he's calling us to do the same. To be a church that listens well, welcomes generously and creates places where people can simply belong.

That's why I'm excited about some of the things we are beginning to plan for the autumn. Alongside our regular worship, we're preparing to launch Alpha together with SoulSpace, offering people a gentle place to explore faith and ask life's bigger questions. We're also exploring a monthly Saturday morning men's breakfast, a relaxed space for friendship, conversation and mutual support. Neither of these ideas began with a committee meeting. They began with conversations, prayer and people sensing that God might already be opening a door.

One of the greatest lessons I've been learning recently is that ministry isn't about filling a diary with activities. It's about paying attention to where God is already moving.

Sometimes we spend so much time asking God to bless our plans that we forget to ask where he's inviting us to join his.

As summer begins, many of us will enjoy a change of routine. Some will be travelling, others will be spending time with grandchildren, family and friends, and some will simply be enjoying a slower pace. I hope we all find time to rest. Rest isn't something we earn when we've worked hard enough, it is a gift from God. Even Jesus stepped away from the crowds to pray, to be still and simply be with his Father.

Perhaps this summer we might all take time to notice God a little more. Notice him in the beauty of creation, in an unexpected conversation, in an answered prayer, or in the quiet moments that are so easily overlooked.

Thank you for allowing me the privilege of walking this journey of faith with you. It is such a joy to serve as your priest, and I genuinely believe that God has exciting things ahead for St John's. We don't know exactly what the next chapter will look like, but we do know the One who is writing the story.

So wherever this summer takes you, may you know God's peace, his strength and his joy. May you return refreshed, ready to discover together all that he has in store for us.

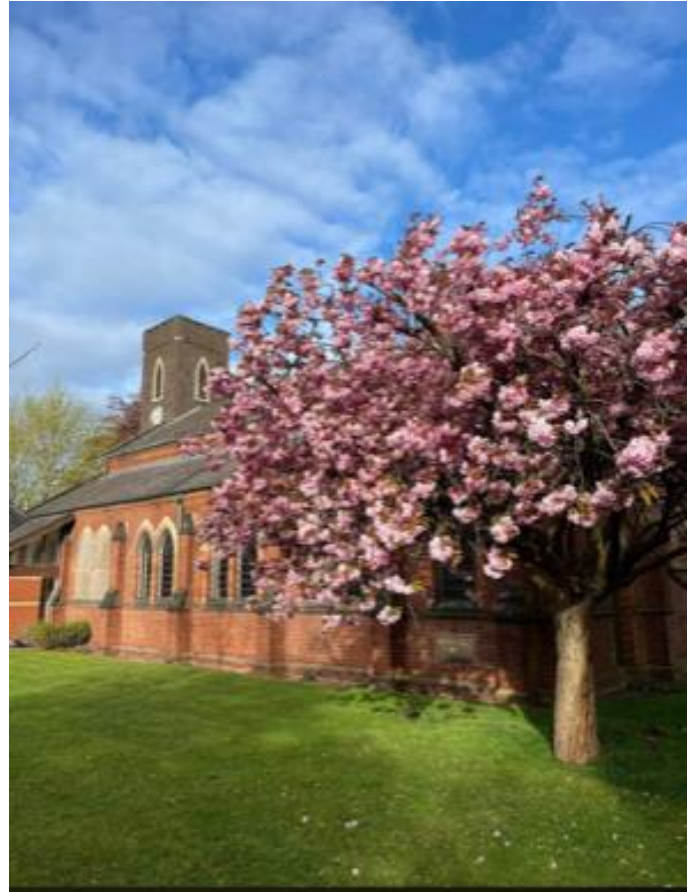
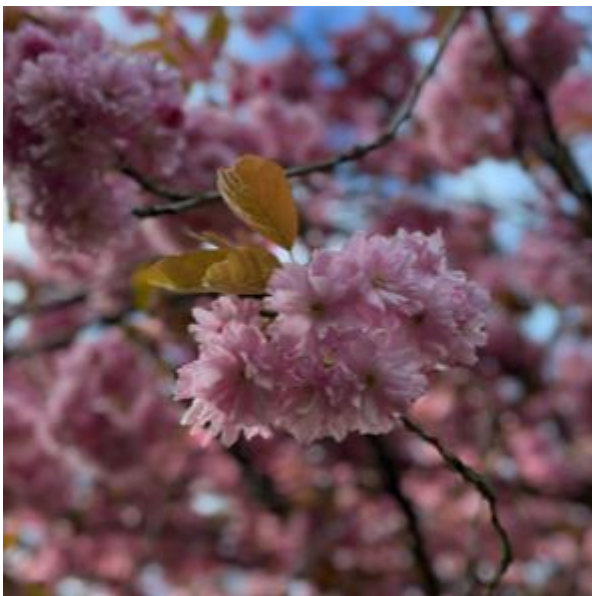
**Did you know?** That we also collect for Walsall North Food Bank here at St John's. A donation box is located at the front of Church. Walsall North Foodbank operates from Pelsall Methodist Church and opened in 2014 as an initiative by local Churches Together, comprising St John's Walsall Wood, St Mark's Shelfield, St Michael & All Angels Pelsall and Pelsall Methodist Church. They are part of the Trussell Network of foodbanks in the UK and run two sessions per week on Tuesday 11-1.00pm and Friday 1-3.00pm. Food is distributed on a referral basis and clients must have a valid food voucher issued to them to allow them to collect a food parcel containing 3 days worth of nutritionally balanced food.





## Beautiful Blossom at St John's Church

You may have noticed back in May that our beautiful blossom trees surrounding St John's Church came out to bloom. As you can see from these stunning photos taken by Foodilicious café that they came out in full force.



Generically speaking these gorgeous floral shows can be enjoyed from late February right the way through to early June.

The exact bloom times depend on the season, weather and temperature.

The process of cherry trees blossoming and bearing fruit can be seen as a **metaphor for spiritual growth and the importance of “bearing fruit” in our Christian lives (John 15:1-8)**. This imagery encourages self-reflection and a commitment to living out our faith in tangible ways.

Nature is a wonderful testament of God and creation. He has put so much effort into each animal, plant and each flower. When we stop and look closely enough, we can learn some of life's simplest lessons.

## Sculpture of Jesus Christ at the British Ironworks Centre, Oswestry

Looking for a day out? In February this year the British Ironworks Centre in Oswestry revealed their artwork that is being added to its Ironworks faith zone.

The intricately detailed sculpture of Jesus Christ is crafted entirely from scrap and recycled metal. The centre stated that:

"Christian faith centres on the belief that Jesus is the son of God, who is worshipped alongside God the Father, and the Holy

Spirit, commonly referred to together as The Trinity. We want to deliver one single memory through our sculpture Faith Zone to symbolise that there is just one human race, and even though we may follow various religions, we are all one people and should care for and look after one another." Clive Knowles, chairman of the British Ironwork Centre, added: "We've spent two years preparing and perfecting this sculpture of Jesus Christ, as we know it will matter tremendously to our surrounding communities and our visitors."



The Ironworks Centre displays a host of different pieces of artwork to be enjoyed by all ages, along with a play area and café. Entry prices start from £5 per person. For more information visit

## Mediterranean Potato Tray Bake Recipe

A simple tray bake mix of Mediterranean veg and potatoes makes an easy delicious, vibrant dinner – with minimal washing up!

Prep: 10 mins    Cook: 25 mins

Serves 4



### Ingredients

- 800g salad potatoes, thickly sliced
- 50g pine nuts, chopped
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 courgette
- 1 red pepper, deseeded and sliced
- 1 tablespoon red pesto

### Method

1. Preheat the oven to 200C (180C fan, gas mark 6).
2. Put the potatoes, chopped vegetables and pine nuts in a large roasting tin. Drizzle with the oil and toss to coat. Bake for 20 minutes, or until tender.
3. Add the pesto, if using, and bake for another 5 minutes. Serve immediately.

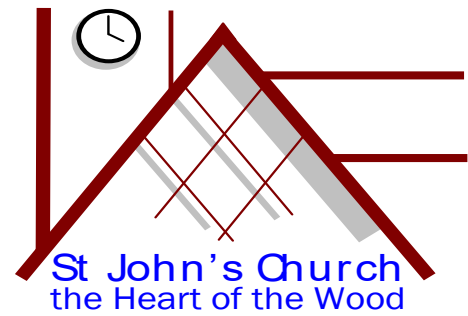

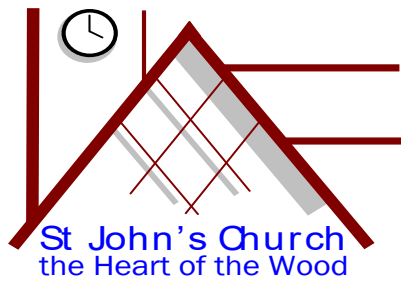
