First Reading 1 Kings 3:5-6a, 7-12

When the Lord asks Solomon what he wants, he asks for
wise understanding and a discerning mind to govern the
people. God promises to grant Solomon's request.

Second Reading Romans 8:28-30

God the Father has called us to share in his glory,
intending the Son to be the firstborn among many.

Gospel Matthew 13:44-52

A series of parables in which Jesus compares the kingdom
of heaven to treasure in a field, a fine pearl and a dragnet.

FIRST READING 1 Kings 3:5-6a, 7-12

A reading from the First Book of Kings.

In those days: The LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night,
and God said, 'Ask what I shall give you.' And Solomon said, 'O LORD
my God, you have made your servant king in place of David my
father, although I am but a little child. I do not know how to go out or
come in. And your servant is in the midst of your people whom you
have chosen, a great people, too many to be numbered or counted
for multitude. Give your servant, therefore, an understanding mind
to govern your people, that I may discern between good and evil,
for who is able to govern this your great people?'

It pleased the LORD that Solomon had asked this. And God said
to him, 'Because you have asked this, and have not asked for
yourself long life, or riches, or the life of your enemies, but have
asked for yourself understanding to discern what is right, behold,
I now do according to your word. Behold, I give you a wise and
discerning mind, so that none like you has been before you and
none like you shall arise after you.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

> At that time: Jesus said to the crowd: 'The kingdom of heaven is
like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up.
Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of
fine pearls, who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold
all that he had and bought it. <

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into
the sea and gathered fish of every kind. When it was full, men
drew it ashore and sat down and sorted the good into containers
but threw away the bad. So it will be at the end of the age. The
angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous
and throw them into the fiery furnace. In that place there will be
weeping and gnashing of teeth.

'Have you understood all these things?' They said to him, 'Yes.'
And he said to them, 'Therefore every scribe who has been trained
for the kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house, who brings
out of his treasure what is new and what is old.'
