News

The Joint Parochial Church Council (JCC) had its inaugural meeting on Wednesday 29th July at Holy Trinity Church. It was a good-natured meeting with lots of excitement for the future, realistic positivity, sharing and a chance for members to get to know each other.

- Revd Dave opened the meeting with a short summary of the journey our parishes have been on in the last five years, with the feeling that we have arrived at a moment of new creation. Much has happened and much awaits. He finished with verses from the song *The Little Church* from the film *Brother Sun, Sister Moon*, about St Francis, which includes these lines:

If you want your dream to be
Take your time, go slowly
Do few things but do them well
Heartfelt work grows purely

Day by day, you'll grow too
You'll know heaven's glory.

Revd Dave commented that, as the song says, our task is, always has been and always will be, enabling everyone to know heaven's glory. If you receive this newsletter online, the full words of the song can be found [by clicking here](#).

This was followed by a short time of prayer.

- Lorraine Ashley (Churchwarden at Crockham Hill) was elected Vice Chair.
- It was agreed to produce a welcome/introductory flier or booklet to encourage people to stand for roles on the PCCs and JCC in the future.
- There was a realistic conversation about the financial position and governance of both parishes now and in the future, with the current trend of ageing congregations and reduced per capita giving.
 - It was agreed that Treasurer training would be useful,
 - A finance meeting would take place involving the Treasurers and others to see what can be learned from each other about how to manage and report our accounts.
 - It was noted that the PCC at St Mary's is prioritising the organ project at present, so it would be difficult to start an appeal for greater giving for general funds.
 - It was suggested that St Mary's PCC needs professional advice, especially about managing its reserves and funds held in trust.
- Revd Emma led our first discussion about shaping a mission plan for the Benefice. Members shared what excites them and what worries them, and we considered an image of the Benefice as two trees with intertwined roots and canopies, reminding us of the Tree of Life and also the tree that grows

from the mustard seed, bearing fruit and providing shelter for the birds. What birds are missing among our branches?

- Members felt that the churches have much in common, including their history and tradition, but they also have distinct identities; the Benefice's strength lies in both our commonality and our difference.
- There was conversation about mission among different age groups, and a recognition of the need to be creative in reaching out.
- A Prayer Group for the Benefice's mission was suggested.
- It was agreed to work towards a Benefice Directory, which people could join to help foster a sense of community, care and enable better communication.
- Having discussed the parishes' financial positions, it was agreed that we would begin work on how to fairly apportion shared costs.
- The meeting finished with the Grace.

The next meeting is on 9th September in the John Frith Room at Westerham.

Thank you to the Community Payback team from Kent County Council for tidying up the cremation area at Westerham. The hedge in this area will also be cut back in the next few weeks. We are grateful to both Community Payback and David, our contract mower for their continued hard work in maintaining the churchyard; plus David Booker and Rodney for organising the work. We would be lost without them all.



What - or who - has seen 7 monarchs, 27 Prime Ministers and 11 Vicars during their lifetime?
