THE GOSPEL

²² Immediately Jesus made the disciples get
into the boat and go on ahead to the other
side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³ And
after he had dismissed the crowds, he went
up the mountain by himself to pray. When
evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴ but by
this time the boat, battered by the waves,
was far from the land, for the wind was
against them. ²⁵ And early in the morning he
came walking towards them on the lake.
²⁶ But when the disciples saw him walking on
the lake, they were terrified, saying, 'It is a
ghost!' And they cried out in fear. ²⁷ But
immediately Jesus spoke to them and said,
'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.'

²⁸ Peter answered him, 'Lord, if it is you,
command me to come to you on the water.'

²⁹ He said, 'Come.' So Peter got out of the

boat, started walking on the water, and came towards Jesus. ³⁰ But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, 'Lord, save me!' ³¹ Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, 'You of little faith, why did you doubt?' ³² When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³ And those in the boat worshipped him, saying, 'Truly you are the Son of God.'
