Season of Creation

There has been a growing movement across Christians Churches to mark a Season of Creation in September. It was introduced in 1989 by the Ecumenical Patriarch of the Orthodox Church and adopted by Churches Together in Britain and Ireland in 2008. This year the Church of England introduced the Festival of Creation in Christ on the 1st Sunday in September.



The Season of Creation runs from 1 September to 4 October (Feast of St Francis). Please look out for opportunities, coming soon, to be involved.



Eco Tip of the week

Over 7 million tonnes of food waste is produced by UK households each year, so our tips aim to help you alter your shopping habits to reduce your food waste:

1. Plan ahead - reduce the amount of food you throw out by planning your meals before you shop. Planning ahead will ensure that you only buy what you need whilst also giving you the option to prepare food beforehand to save time on days you want to spend less time cooking.

2. Buy misshapen foods - large amounts of edible fruit and vegetables are rejected by supermarkets and end up being wasted purely because they are considered too ugly for purchase. Yet these produce are just as tasty, so why are they left to rot and causing farmers to need to overproduce? Some supermarkets are now starting to sell these misshapen foods, often at discounted prices. So next time you food shop, look to see if there is the option to buy misshapen produce.
